Message from the Priests

Christ on the Cross is a Fountain of Blessings

The cross is just 2 wooden pieces intersecting each other. What makes it HOLY is Christ who died upon it. The cross was a SIMPLE plank of wood that was stained with the PRECIOUS BLOOD of Christ because on this ALTAR the Lamb of God was sacrificed. Christ did not deserve the Cross; we deserved it. Yet, He took our cross, He underwent our pain, and He died our death. So the most worrying aspect of humanity is death. The cross reminds us that the death is conquered. All the sufferings of our life are not greater then. We need to gather strength looking at Christ on the Cross in times of our struggle. For we will be victorious through the strength of God, just like Christ is victorious. Suffering is not a sign of curse but of sanctification. Jesus invites us by saying, one who wishes to follow me must take up your cross and follow me. So let us see how the cross is the sanctifying grace.

Jesus on the Cross - Throne of the Savior

We see the lifeless body of Christ, bathed in blood, wounded by nails, crowned by thorns with an inscription of INRI (Jesus of Nazarene the King of the Jews) written. It's the "Throne of the Savior" from which Jesus redeemed the world.

Jesus IN the Cross – Monument of LOVE: We see the "greatness of God's infinite love" who died for us and also "cruelty of man's sin" which killed the savior. It's the "Monument of Love" which tells the greatest love story: "there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for his friend".

Christ BEYOND the Cross – Prelude to glory: we see the glory of God, because the misery and agony of death on the cross led to the glory of Resurrection. Though it was a death bed, yet it became a "Prelude to glory", the pathway to Eternity, a bridge between earth and heaven. No Cross, No Crown.

Christ BY the Cross – Weapon of Victory: Jesus through his death on the cross conquered the death, ransom of sin was paid, Satan's power was defeated, Heaven was won back and above all Salvation was purchased. It's the "Weapon of Victory". Jesus was not defeated on the Cross, but by the Cross, He defeated the power of hell.

Christ FROM the cross – Fountain of Grace: The executioners were forgiven, Blessed Virgin Mary is given as mother to the humanity, Paradise was promised to the repentant thief and spirit is offered to the Father. We gave bitter vinegar to the Jesus on the Cross but He shed water and blood. It is a fountain of grace, mercy and forgiveness which flows down to us.

Christ ON the Cross – Instrument of Salvation: The curse of the cross was changed into blessing, shame into grace, punishment into redemption, torture into endurance, death into life. it's the "Instrument of Salvation" by which we are saved. It's not just the symbol of Christianity, but the essence of Christian life.

Everyone has some kind of problems in the journey of life. It is in those moments of our life that we need to look at Jesus on the Cross. He strengthens us in our struggles of life. Just like He is victorious, He too will help us to conquer our struggles of life. This is my personal conviction as well. God bless you all!




