Message from the Priests

Something a Little Different: Concluded

Many people have commented on the incredible stories and experiences that people have shared about the Eucharistic Congress in the bulletin. These weren't just stories and experiences of the priests, but of lay men and women who took time out of their busy lives so that they could go meet God in a powerful way. I want to thank those people who have shared their experiences with us. While people in God's Country value hearing about things like this from their priests, to hear the hopes, dreams, and

aspirations for our parishes from fellow parishioners has been inspiring to many. We all want our parishes to be places where people are burning with love for Jesus Christ. And, so while the parishioners' reflections have come to an end, I just want to encourage you to keep diving deeper into the Eucharist and to keep inspiring each other.

Inspiring others isn't just icing on the cake, but is an essential part of what it means to have been baptized in Christ. When we were baptized, we became someone who is responsible for sharing the message of who Jesus Christ is with others. Sharing our faith isn't something that we are often comfortable with though. I often hear people fret that they feel like they



don't know enough or that they haven't experienced something as cool or profound as somebody else.

But I want you to think about it this way: sharing our stories of God's big and little miracles in our lives is like sharing food with people who are starving. And people, whether they know it or not, are starving for God! They may call that hunger different names: they are hungering for greatness, for meaning, or for hope, to name a few. But all of those things are nicknames for God. People are hungering and thirsting for God. In Luke chapter 9, Jesus and the Apostles are surrounded by 5,000 people who are hungry. The Apostles are afraid to provide food for all those people. They don't think they have enough or that what they do have could possibly satisfy the hunger of the people around them. But Jesus reminds them that He is with them and tells them, "Give them some food yourselves". Sharing stories of the powerful presence of our God is like food in the midst of people who are starving. If we hoard the food from the people around us who are starving, that's not good. We have to share it.

What are some little ways that you can share Jesus with those around you? Maybe it's as small as just sharing a time when the Lord answers your prayers. For someone who is starving to know that there is a God out there who loves them and cares for them enough to listen to their prayers and respond, that's no snack... It's a buffet of Hope!

Maybe it's praying with your kids in situations when you don't ordinarily pray with them. For a kid who is starving for things to be okay when he or she is in trouble, how powerful could it be for a parent to pray and to thank God for the gift of that child when he or she least expects it?

Even just that small, almost throw away offer to say that you will pray for someone who expresses a need for you and to mean it, means so much to someone who is just desperate for help.

I hope that the reflections of your fellow parishioners have been inspirational to you and fed your own hunger for what could be in each of your lives. But don't let it stop there! Jesus wants you to share Him with everyone you meet. How will you share Him today?



Week 10 Local Parishioner Testimonial National Eucharistic Congress



It is really hard to try to sum up the Eucharistic Congress. It was a week filled with top notch speakers and exhibits, daily confessions, Mass and adoration. I got to meet Dr. Edward Sri (I am a huge fan.) It really was a "Catholic Disney Land." Seeing hundreds of deacons, priests, bishops, cardinals and religious process into the stadium for Mass and down the streets of Indy was awe inspiring. When the stadium filled with 60,000 sang "Here I Am Lord," I could barely choke out the words, and I had goosebumps (Holy Ghostbumps). Celebrating Mass, adoration and the Eucharistic procession with thousands of my Catholic brothers and sisters was amazing! However, here is the thing, I have been to many Catholic conferences before, on a much smaller scale, and it is so easy to come home on a spiritual high and to not feed that. It is so easy to live conference to conference chasing that high, and I didn't want that to happen. The day after we returned from the Congress I was at the Dayton Correctional Institute. I help with the Prison Ministry through the archdiocese. We had Mass that day and as I was kneeling in that prison chapel with women convicted of unspeakable crimes, it hit me. The Jesus that was on that altar was the same Jesus that was on the altar in the stadium filled with 60,000 "good" Catholics, and He died for each and every one of us! Lord, don't ever let me forget this!


