Pro Populo Masses and Private Masses

One of the most amazing things about being a priest is being able to be there for people. We're privileged to be able to be there for the best parts in people's lives: their baptisms, weddings, First Communions and Confessions, anniversaries, and so much more. But we're also privileged (and, yes, as weird as it might sound, most priests really do consider it a privilege) to be there for the worst moments in people's lives: the death of a loved one, whether expected or unexpected, hardships in marriage, the shame and guilt of feeling trapped by sin or circumstances, to just name a few. Those moments when we are able to be there for people, praying for them and being a source of God's strength, are some of the most treasured memories of my time as a priest. But I also know that, for every person that asks to talk through those tough times of their lives, there are so many people that feel like they have to suffer alone or that the priest doesn't have time for them. If that's you, hear me loud and clear: you do matter to us! We do have time for you! Priests aren't just here to offer the Sacraments and then quietly live in the seclusion of the rectory for the rest of the week. We're here for you no matter what you're going through!

One of the ways that priests, and particularly the pastor, is instructed by the Church to be there for the people--both in their known and unknown joys, struggles, triumphs, and tribulations--is that pastors are required to celebrate a Mass *pro populo* or *for the people*. Canon 534 of the Church's Law stipulates that a pastor "is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation" for their good and the good of all the souls in his parish territory (whether they are Catholic or not, practicing or not, believing or not). So whenever you see a Mass listed in the bulletin as being "for the people", just know that that Mass is being offered for you, your family, and all those around you. You are being prayed for in a powerful way!

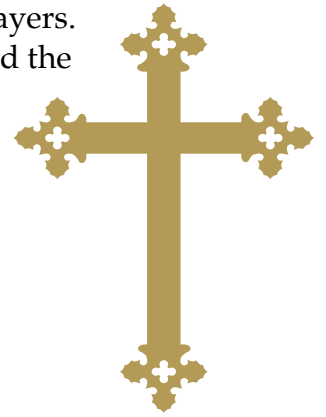
Inspiration for my Private Masses

A few weeks ago, I was praying and talking with God about a few situations that really tug at my heart: one couple that I had just talked to had miscarried a baby and there was another couple that I was getting ready to talk to that was struggling with the cross of infertility. My heart goes out to everyone and anyone in need, but in a special way it goes out to people in these situations. I can only imagine the pain that those families are going through. I resolved that every first Tuesday (my day off) of the month, I will offer Mass for all couples in our parishes that are struggling especially with those two crosses. While I will offer these Masses for all couples going through this generally, if anyone wants me to remember them and their situation particularly at those Masses, please let me know and I will do so.



Sts. Anne and Joachim, the mother and father of Mary, are the patron saint of couples struggling with infertility. Tradition holds that they carried this cross until later in life when – finally! – they conceived Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth and Mother of God!

No matter what your cross is, know that you are in my and all of the priests' prayers. We're here for you and want God to be powerful in your lives, both in the good and the bad. If there's anything we can do to help you through the tough situations that life throws at us sometimes, please let us know.

This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.

MINISTRY SCHEDULING CHANGES — As of February 3, 2025, Holy Cross Family of Parishes will no longer be using the Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP) to schedule ministry appointments for any of the ministry appointments at our churches. All ministers will be emailed a schedule covering 2 months at a time along with a contact list of ministers. Copies of the ministry schedules and contact lists will also be available in the back of the churches for anyone who does not have email. Each minister is responsible for finding their replacement if a sub is needed for their scheduled appointment. Please use the contact lists that will be provided to find your replacement. Note: If you need any changes made to how you are scheduled, please contact either parish office. For the Coldwater parishes, contact Julie at the Coldwater office and for the Ft. Recovery parishes, contact Karen at the Ft. Recovery office.

UPDATE ON WEEKDAY WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY — If school is delayed or closed for Coldwater School District on a Tuesday morning, then morning Mass at St. Mary will be live streamed from and relocated to either Holy Trinity or Mary Help of Christians depending on which priest is scheduled for the Mass. If school is delayed or closed for Ft. Recovery School District on a Thursday morning, then morning Mass at St. Paul will be live streamed from and relocated to either Holy Trinity or Mary Help of Christians depending on which priest is scheduled for the Mass. If Fr. Witt or Fr. Moore is scheduled for the Mass, then it will be held at Mary Help of Christians. If Fr. Joseph or Fr. Barry is scheduled for the Mass, then it will be held at Holy Trinity. Evening Masses will be determined later in the day if a cancellation or relocation is necessary. A OneCall notice will go out to the "Mass Times" group as soon as possible in all of these situations. All parishioners are welcome to attend Mass at the new locations if Mass is relocated. Please use your discretion and be attentive to the weather conditions if you decide to attend.

GLUTEN ALLERGY — If you or a family member have an allergy to gluten and cannot receive Holy Communion, we would like for you to contact either family office. We would love to be able to figure out alternate options to make Holy Communion available to you.

Tables will be set up in either the basement of our churches or the parish halls next to our churches. The tables will be marked where to put different types of items. 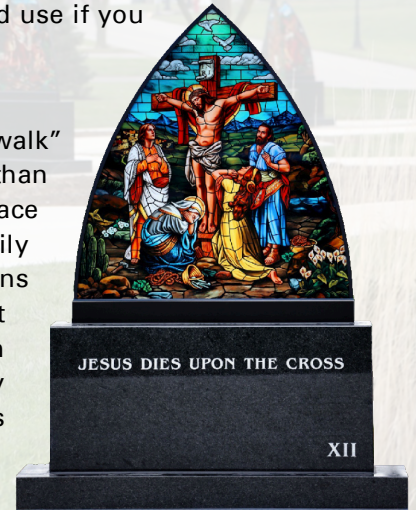

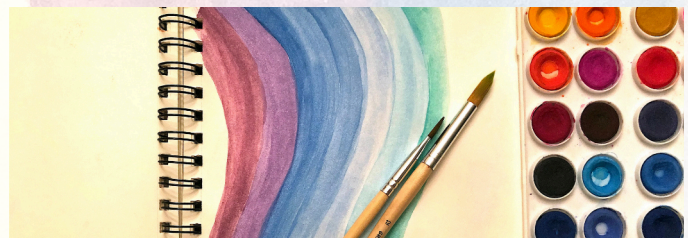

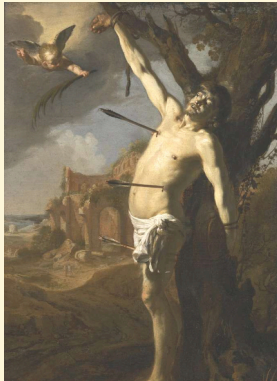

Saint of the Week - Saint Sebastian

He joined the Roman Army in 283 AD, ostensibly to be of service to other Christians who were being persecuted by the Romans. St. Sebastian distinguished himself, and for his excellent service, he was promoted to serve in the Praetorian Guard to protect Emperor Diocletian. While serving as a Praetorian Guard, Marcus and Marcellian, twin brothers, were imprisoned for refusing to make public sacrifices to the Roman gods. The brothers were deacons of the Christian Church. During their imprisonment, their parents visited them to implore them to renounce Christianity. However, St. Sebastian convinced both parents to convert to Christianity. St. Sebastian also converted several other prominent individuals, including the local prefect. This led to his discovery, and he was reported as a Christian to Emperor Diocletian in 286. The Emperor, who was already infamous for ordering the deaths of hundreds of Christians, scolded Sebastian and ordered him to be killed by having him tied to a stake on a training field and used as target practice. Archers riddled his body with arrows. His body was described as, "full of arrows as an urchin." Believed to be dead, the archers left his body for retrieval and burial. He was recovered by Irene of Rome, whose Christian husband was a servant to Diocletian and also martyred. Irene discovered that Sebastian was still living, and she hid him and nursed him back to health. Once well, Sebastian went in search of Diocletian to surprise him. He managed to catch Diocletian by a stairwell and proceeded to criticize him loudly and publicly for his persecution of the Christians. Diocletian, surprised that Sebastian was still alive, was immediately taken aback, but recovered his composure. This time, he would not permit Sebastian to escape with his life. He ordered his former guard to be beaten to death with clubs, then thrown into the sewers. His body was recovered by a Christian woman, named Lucina, and she secretly buried him in the catacombs beneath Rome.

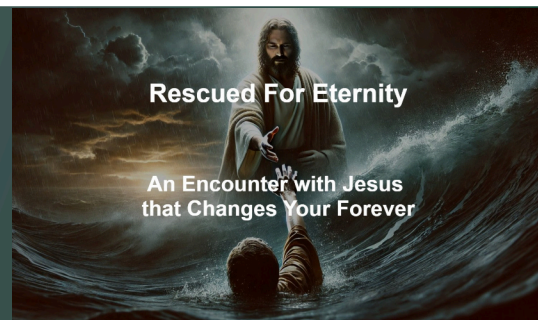
