Candlemas

February 2nd is always celebrated as the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple. Under Mosaic Law found in the Book of Leviticus, a Jewish woman who gave birth to a child was considered unclean (see 12:1-8). The mother of a newborn could not routinely go out into public and had to avoid all things sacred, including the Temple for at least 40 days.

Now, it's important to remember that this was a *ceremonial seclusion*. It was not the result of sin or some kind of wrongdoing on the part of the mother. We know this most of all because Mary, the ever spotless Mother of God, complied with the ritual, though being sinless, she certainly did not have to do so. But she submitted to the humbling requirements of the law. She remained at home for 40 days, denied herself all association with sacred things and, on the day required, walked the five miles from Bethlehem to the Temple in Jerusalem. Arriving at the Temple, Mary likely stood in line and waited her turn to see the priest so that this Firstborn Son of hers could be



dedicated to God. Mary didn't think of herself through all of this, but did everything for the honor and glory of God!

While she was there, Simeon, a just man and a prophet who frequented the Temple regularly, recognized Jesus as the Christ Child. He held Jesus and exclaimed this hymn of thanksgiving:

Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a **light for revelation** to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel (Luke 2:29-32).

Because Simeon recognized Jesus as the *light for revelation to the Gentiles* (non-Jewish people), the Church has traditionally taken this feast day as an opportunity to bless the candles we use in Mass.

Candles are used in Mass to remind us of Jesus, who is the true *light of the world*. Without Jesus, we walk in darkness. It's a thought worth reflecting on when we see the candles at Mass being lit or used in procession: this measly candle points us to the great light of the world: Jesus Christ, who is a light too brilliant for my feeble body, mind, and soul to perceive. Just as our eyes need to adjust to light whenever we move from a dark place to a place of light, a life of prayer should help our soul adjust to the never-ending light that is Heaven. There Jesus, the Lamb of God who was slain, yet lives forever, will be our light forever (see Revelation 21:23)!




