### More Adoration, Please!

As priests, we get a lot of requests, but requests like the title of this bulletin insert always make my heart soar!

Adoration is a period of time where Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist is placed in a special vessel, called a *monstrance*, so that people can come and spend time with Him, loving Him and letting Him know the things that they need. I like to think of it as the great King holding court so that little peasants (like me!) can come to Him and let our great King provide for all our needs.



I want to say a word of gratitude for all those who have been attending adoration and those who have asked me (often) for more adoration times and places. As you can tell from the proposed schedule (below), we have tried to provide at least a little time at each of our parishes. Members of these parishes helped to come up with these times and what we could reasonably expect. Some of the times are more limited than others. This is, in part, because exposing the Eucharist is something that only a priest or a deacon can ordinarily do. If you were hoping for more adoration time, then please, continue to let me know. I want this new schedule to be more of a "starting point" that, as we grow together as a parish family in our love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist, this schedule can grow with us.

In the meantime, members of your parish will be helping me to coordinate volunteers for each of the hours. Feel free to sign up for any hours you would like at any of the parishes. We need at least two separate people for each hour. Also, if you have been signed up for an hour, but the time or location no longer works for you, please let us know. Let's work together as a parish family to make this happen!



# The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
- 6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.

### Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony involves more than just "booking" a particular date for a wedding. Please keep in mind that church dates are limited. It is highly recommended to book the church when booking your reception hall. Also, since the marriage preparation process usually takes several months to complete, please contact the Family Office at least nine months in advance to start the marriage preparation process.

### **Baptismal Sponsors**

This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.







### Join in praying the Rosary before our Masses within the Holy Cross Family of Parishes

(Feel free to cut this guide out & take it to Mass with you!)

### **How to Pray the Rosary**

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 2. Pray the Apostles' Creed while holding the Crucifix.
- 3. On the first bead, pray an Our Father.
- 4. Pray one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads.
- 5. Pray the Glory Be followed by the Fatima Prayer.
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery then Pray the Our Father.
- 7. For each set of ten beads, Pray ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery.
- 8. After finishing each decade, Pray the Glory Be followed by the Fatima Prayer.
- 9. After the five decades are completed, Pray the The Salve Regina followed by the Rosary Prayer and then the St. Michael Prayer.

### Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

### **Our Father**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

### **Hail Mary**



### Saint of the Week - Saint Peter Damian



Maybe because he was orphaned and had been treated shabbily by one of his brothers, Peter Damian was very good to the poor. It was the ordinary thing for him to have a poor person or two with him at table and he liked to minister personally to their needs. Peter escaped poverty and the neglect of his own brother when his other brother, who was archpriest of Ravenna, took him under his wing. His brother sent him to good schools and Peter became a professor. Already in those days, Peter was very strict with himself. He wore a hair shirt under his clothes, fasted rigorously and spent many hours in prayer. Soon, he decided to leave his teaching and give himself completely to prayer with the Benedictines of the reform of Saint Romuald at Fonte Avellana. They lived two monks to a hermitage. Peter was so eager to pray and slept so little that he soon suffered from severe insomnia. He found he had to use some prudence in taking care of himself. When he was not praying, he studied the Bible. The abbot commanded that when he died Peter should succeed him. Abbot Peter founded five other hermitages. He encouraged his brothers in a life of prayer and solitude and wanted nothing more for himself. The Holy See periodically called on him, however, to be a peacemaker or troubleshooter, between two abbeys in dispute or a cleric or government official in some disagreement with Rome. Finally, Pope Stephen IX made Peter the cardinal-bishop of Ostia. He worked hard to wipe out simony—the buying of church offices-and encouraged his priests to observe celibacy and urged even the diocesan clergy to live together and maintain scheduled prayer and religious observance. He wished to restore primitive discipline among religious and priests, warning against needless travel, violations of poverty, and too comfortable living. He even wrote to the bishop of Besancon complaining that the canons there sat down when they were singing the psalms in the Divine Office. He wrote many letters. Some 170 are extant. We also have 53 of his sermons and seven lives, or biographies, that he wrote. He preferred examples and stories rather than theory in his writings. The liturgical offices he wrote are evidence of his talent as a stylist in Latin. He asked often to be allowed to retire as cardinal-bishop of Ostia, and finally Pope Alexander II consented. Peter was happy to become once again just a monk, but he was still called to serve as a papal legate. When returning from such an assignment in Ravenna, he was overcome by a fever. With the monks gathered around him saying the Divine Office, he died on February 22, 1072. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.


