If I Could Really See...

I was listening to a debate between a Catholic apologist named Joe Heschmeyer and a Protestant pastor named James White. The entire debate was about whether the Mass really sanctifies us. Naturally, as Catholics, we would say “yes”! The Mass is the place and the instrument by which Jesus’ one and eternal sacrifice on the Cross is brought into our here and now so that, by eating the Flesh of the Son of Man, we may have eternal life (see John 6).

But the thing that really struck me during the debate was the Protestant pastor’s description of the Mass. Over and over again, he described the Catholic view of the Mass as “coming to the Cross of the Lord”. Even though he, as a non-Catholic, would not hold this view. I still thought that it was a beautiful way to accurately sum up what we believe the Mass is. The Mass is coming to the Cross of the Lord. And it made me wonder: how many of us really think of the Mass in that simple way?

Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist. The same man-God who walked the streets of Galilee 2,000 years ago lives in our tabernacles and gives Himself to us in Holy Communion. When we see the Eucharist, do we really engage our Catholic imagination with this fact? Do we really take the time to consider that this is Jesus before us? That underneath the appearance of bread and wine is Jesus: bloodied and bruised by the beatings, His arms outstretched encompassing the whole earth, His shoulder probably pulled out of its socket, His back and head still dripping blood, His face covered in a mixture of sweat, blood, and tears, on His face a look of pain, but a pain that says, “yes, this is worth it, all of this is worth it for my beloved child who has entered into this church today!”

If this is what I could see when I saw the Eucharist, what would my genuflection look like? What would I be thinking about? Could I let my mind and my heart be distracted if I could see clearly the look on His face that says that my coldness of heart is more painful than all of the torture He endured? Would I resent having to be at Mass if I could see the nails in His hands? Would I call the Mass too long if I sat there next to His weeping, inconsolable Mother as He suffered for three hours? If I walked up to Him, would it be with a sense of boredom or indifference? Would I leave Him and His mother alone early? Would I just go back to my life unchanged by that encounter? Would I mock His death, if not in my words, but by my actions if I saw the Blood trickling down the wood of that cross? Would I be crazy enough to sin if I saw so clearly what my sin cost Him? Would I drive past the church without even looking at it? Would I be more kind, generous, compassionate, or forgiving if I could meet His eyes as He looked at me?

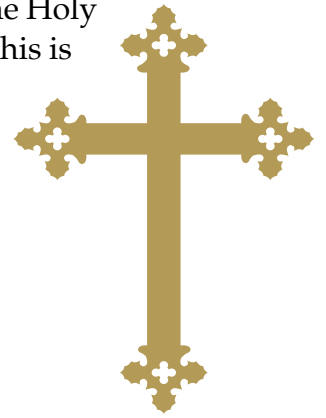

In a way, it's a mercy of God that we can't see the physical transformation of the Eucharist...I don't think I could stomach it or bear the fact that my heart can be so cold and distracted at Mass sometimes. What would my life look like if every time I knelt down in church or came before the Holy Eucharist, I took the time to imagine all this and realize that this is truly Him; that this is what I would see if I could truly see? Thanks be to God, both for the reality of the Eucharist: that Jesus is truly present under the appearance of bread and wine...but also thanks be to God that He mercifully and patiently waits for me to realize that He is there and to love Him with all my heart!

Baptismal Sponsors

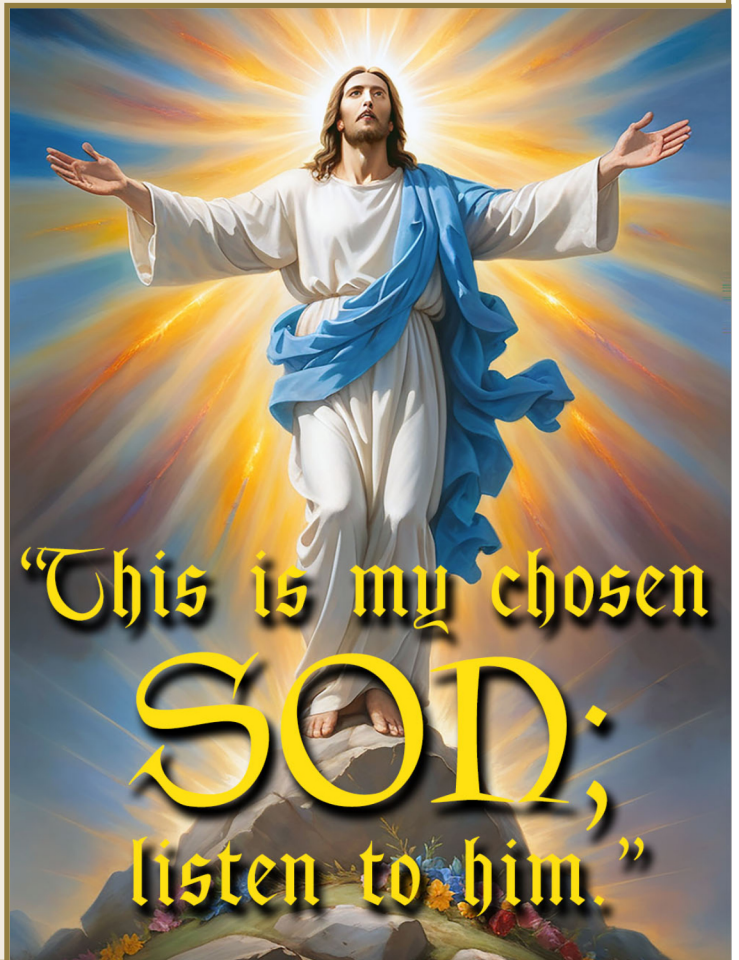

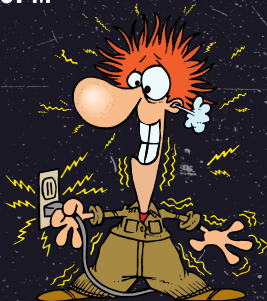

Water for Life

Join Our Parish's Lenten Almsgiving Project

The season of Lent challenges us to unite in sacrifice. It's a time to listen intently to Jesus' call on our lives and find ways to share his love in our hurting world. This Lent, our parish is joining Catholics across the U.S. to raise money for lifesaving water projects in Africa. Our alms will help Cross Catholic Outreach build 145 community water systems, blessing **238,903 people** with a lifetime supply of safe, clean water.

Project Plan

Our donations will set a series of steps in motion, resulting in safe, abundant water!

1. A local nomination process will be used to select villages with the greatest need for clean water. This often involves collaboration among Church leaders, village chiefs and medical professionals.
2. The land will be surveyed to determine the ideal location for a community water system.
3. Plans will be finalized based on local needs — whether it's for a simple hand-pump community well or a solar-powered water tower.
4. A professional crew will drill to the proper depth, ensuring water will flow during the dry season.
5. Villages will elect a committee to oversee the care and sustainability of the water source, and families will be trained in sanitation and hygiene practices.

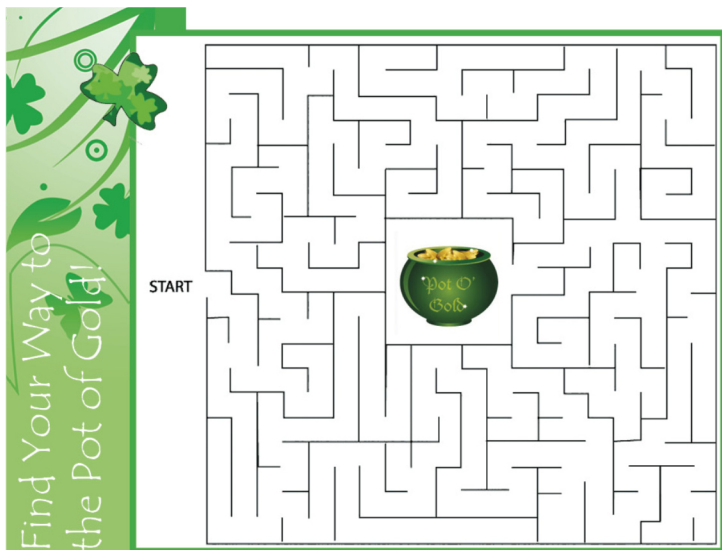

Saint of the Week - Saint JOSEPH (HUSBAND OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY)

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: "With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus" (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as "patron of a happy death." Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth. —Peter Scagnelli
