

GOING TO CONFESSION

Do you remember the first time you went to Confession? If it was when you were in second grade, probably not. Do you remember going to Confession as a kid? I can recall seeing my name on the family calendar by the phone in the kitchen telling me I had to go to Confession on a Saturday each month and then dragging my feet the short walk from Frankfort Street around the corner to St. Augustine Church on Hanover Street in Minster. Up the giant steps I'd go into the dimly lit church, sniffing that "church smell" it had. I knelt down in the back of church near the confessionals, peering up at the great paintings on the ceiling, not wanting to do what I was going to have to do – go to confession.

Then I'd enter the little room of the confessional, kneel down behind the screen and begin, "Bless me Father, for I have sinned..."; after which I would say the same three sins I would say every time I went to confession – I disobeyed my parents, I fought with my brother, and I said some bad words. Every time I would say the same thing. And I'd leave the confessional and kneel down again and say my three Hail Marys, then run home. There was no heartfelt sorrow, no deep introspection of my inner attitudes and outward behavior, no great conversion. That would change when I was a freshman in high school.

That year I went on a retreat at the Bergamo Retreat House in Dayton. A very holy priest introduced me to the depth and grandeur of our Catholic Faith, especially a personal relationship with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and devotion to the Blessed Mother. I was brought to a whole new place in my life. The reality of sin, of grace, of the Church's power to convey salvation as the Body of Christ, hit me like a sledgehammer.

Then came the moment of real spiritual epiphany. I went to Confession with this holy priest... I was genuinely afraid to go in to see him. There was no screen, so I had to go face to face. In this moment of grace, my life was turned around in a profound way. I was shown the compassion of Christ in the sacrament, but also an enlightenment of my sinfulness and his challenge to me to live my life differently. It was then that I decided to try to be holy and to do God's Will.

Since then, I still have a difficulty going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It's never easy. I think we all kind of try to not paint ourselves in such dark colors, saying, "I'm doing much better in this or that", not wanting to simply admit our failings. We also tend to not make that firm purpose of amendment. We are so reluctant to really commit ourselves to fight against our sinful tendencies.

I think it's time for us to make a good confession and turn our lives over to God, trusting that the way of life He wants for us is really the best for us, saying no to sin and yes to God. That could be a great goal for us this Lent.



Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony involves more than just "booking" a particular date for a wedding. Please keep in mind that church dates are limited. It is highly recommended to book the church when booking your reception hall. Also, since the marriage preparation process usually takes several months to complete, please contact the Family Office at least nine months in advance to start the marriage preparation process.



The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
- 6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.



Baptismal Sponsors

This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.

Polarization Impact

Democrats, Republicans, and Independents seemingly live in separate and divided worlds and the pandemic has deepened this divide. But political disagreements are important for a healthy democracy.

The problem is that the **political divisions are limiting our ability to function effectively as a country**. People tend to trust and associate only with people on their side which has intensified the division between the two parties.

A Pew Research Study in October 2019 found a majority of respondents wanted less divisiveness and more cooperation. Both Trump (86%) and Biden (89%) supporters said that their preferred candidate, if elected, should focus on addressing the needs of all Americans, "even if it meant disappointing some of his supporters."

Saint of the Week - Saint Toribio De Mogrovejo

In times of crisis, God always "surprises" the Church with unlikely saints, through whom Christ's light radiates beyond their local communities to illumine the universal Church. Charles Borromeo was such a saint: appointed Archbishop of Milan at twenty-one by his papal uncle, epitomizing the corruption that the Reformers condemned, Charles instead inspired a revival that reinvigorated a Church devastated by



the Reformation. His less well-known contemporary, Toribio de Mongrovejo, was God's "saintly surprise" in the New World. Spanish-born lawyer, professor, head of the feared Inquisition, Toribio was still a layman when a grateful king appointed him Archbishop of far-off Lima. Once in Peru, however, Toribio was appalled at the abuse of indigenous peoples by the occupying conquistadores—his fellow countrymen—and by the complicity of the clergy. He became the natives' devoted advocate, building churches, schools, hospitals, and the first seminary in the Americas, publishing catechisms and prayerbooks in the native languages he painstakingly mastered. Four hundred years later, whenever Pope Benedict welcomes Latin American bishops to Rome, he always invokes "the shining example of San Toribio."
