Eucharistic Adoration enhances our Relationship with God

The Eucharist is a fire which inflames us – St. John Damascene

The Holy Cross family of parishes is so blessed to have adoration of the Eucharistic Lord in all the parishes. It is a great opportunity for everyone of us with our personal relationship with Jesus our Lord, who is really present in the Blessed Sacrament. We will have the same experience of Moses, who had an encounter with God in the burning bush, like people of Israel who had felt the presence of the Lord with possession of the ark. So we have the Eucharist as the real presence of the Lord only if we believe in it.

Eucharistic Adoration is a profound way to enhance our relationship with Christ. By spending time in His real presence, we come closer to understanding His love for us. The Eucharist, which is the Body of Christ, invites us into a personal encounter with Him. This time of quiet prayer and reflection allows us to listen attentively to His voice in our hearts. Through Adoration, we grow in intimacy with Jesus, allowing Him to speak directly to our souls. Each moment spent before the Blessed Sacrament is an opportunity to deepen our love and devotion to Christ. The stillness of Adoration fosters a space where we can reflect on His sacrifice for our salvation. We are reminded of His ultimate gift on the Cross, and this deepens our gratitude and reverence.

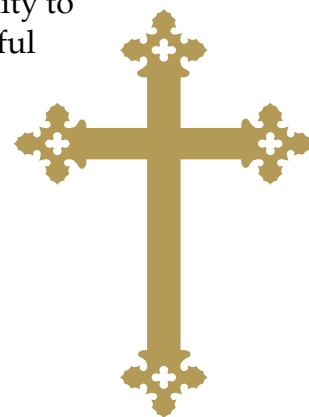
As we adore Him, we also learn to humble ourselves, recognizing His greatness and our dependence on His mercy. Eucharistic Adoration teaches us to sit in God's presence with patience and openness. The peace we experience before the Eucharist fills us with a sense of calm and spiritual refreshment. In His presence, we find strength to carry on in faith, especially during times of trial or uncertainty. Adoration enables us to be healed spiritually as we bring our burdens and sorrows before Christ. We also experience a deepening of our faith, coming to truly believe in His presence in the Eucharist. The grace we receive through Adoration transforms our hearts, making us more loving and compassionate. Time spent before the Blessed Sacrament inspires a deeper commitment to follow Christ's example in our daily lives.

Eucharistic Adoration fosters an openness to God's will, helping us discern the path He desires for us. As we spend more time with Christ, our prayers become more intimate, focused, and heartfelt. It is also a time to intercede for others, asking Christ to bless and guide those in need. In Eucharistic Adoration, we become more aware of Christ's constant presence in our lives, especially during moments of loneliness or struggle. The experience encourages us to live with the same love and mercy that Christ shows us. The longer we adore Him, the more we desire to imitate His virtues, such as humility, patience, and kindness. It also brings us closer to the Church as a whole, uniting us with the global community of believers in prayer and worship. Adoration deepens our understanding of the Eucharist, strengthening our connection to the sacrament of the altar. It is through Adoration that we are invited to experience the joy of being loved by Christ, the source of all joy. Eucharistic Adoration strengthens our resolve to live out our faith and to share Christ's love with others. It calls us to greater holiness, challenging us to live according to the example Christ set for us. The presence of Christ in the Eucharist transforms our hearts, inviting us to be more compassionate and forgiving. Time in Adoration reminds us of the eternal love Christ has for us, a love that never fades. It teaches us to trust in God's providence, knowing that He is always with us. As we adore Christ, we are filled with hope, knowing that He is the source of all life and

salvation. Through Eucharistic Adoration, our relationship with Christ is enriched, and we are drawn closer to Him with every moment spent in His presence. This is the great opportunity to build our relationship with Christ and help the children to experience how wonderful it is being in the presence of the Lord.

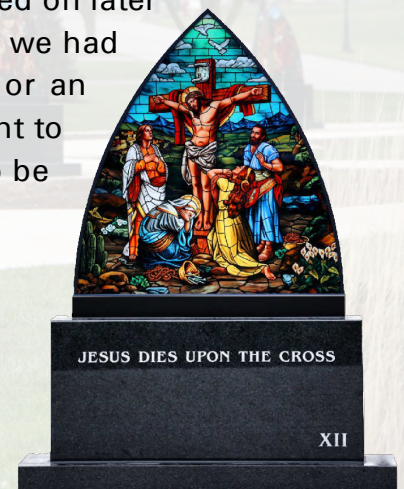

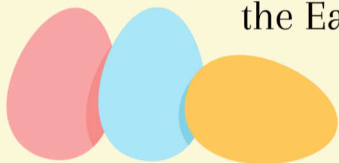

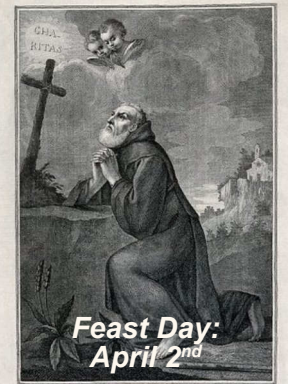
The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.

Saint of the Week - Saint Francis of Paola

A witness to miracles from a young age, Francis of Paola later went on to perform many himself. His parents struggled with infertility, so turned to the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi. Their devout prayers bore them a son, whom they named Francis out of gratitude. As an infant, Francis suffered from swollen eyes and was again healed by his namesake. His parents promised him a friary education, where young Francis voluntarily abstained from meat, practiced solitude, and prayed fervently. After a year, he went on a pilgrimage with his parents to Assisi which deepened his devotion. Upon their return, Francis committed to the life of a hermit, first on family property before moving to a remote cave near the sea. A couple others were inspired by his journey and joined him, forming a small hermitage with a chapel. Over several decades, they expanded to a larger church and monastery as more followers joined. They became known as the Minims Friars, *minim* meaning least to convey their humility. They valued poverty, chastity, obedience, and later added veganism to their vows. Francis is said to have performed many miracles: prophetic speaking, food appearing from nothing, casting out demons, and raising the dead. Despite a life of solitude, he was sought out by many, popes and kings even calling on him for counsel. In his old age, Francis returned to complete solitude for three months, before passing on Good Friday—fitting for a life of perpetual Lent. Francis embodied love for God through radical vocation, giving his all in everything he did. While we may not be as radical in our own lives, the same call of love is extended to us today. — Meghan McDonagh

Democrats, Republicans, and Independents seemingly **live in separate and divided worlds** and the pandemic has deepened this divide. But political disagreements are important for a healthy democracy.

The problem is that the **political divisions are limiting our ability to function effectively as a country**. People tend to trust and associate only with people on their side which has intensified the division between the two parties.

A Pew Research Study in October 2019 found a majority of respondents wanted less divisiveness and more cooperation. Both Trump (86%) and Biden (89%) supporters said that their preferred candidate, if elected, should focus on addressing the needs of all Americans, **"even if it meant disappointing some of his supporters."**
