WHAT ARE YOU GIVING UP FOR EASTER?

During Lent we did the traditional “giving something up”. I gave up soda pop and it was difficult but very fruitful for me personally. What did you do for Lent this year? How did it go? I hope it has helped you in your life as a believing Christian, doing practical sacrifices in order to build self-control, combat sin, and live a more virtuous, holy life. Now, what are you going to do during the Easter Season? Of course, the Easter Season should be marked with the joy and celebration of Christ’s resurrection. Surely, we need this time as a kind of reward for a good sacrificial Lent.

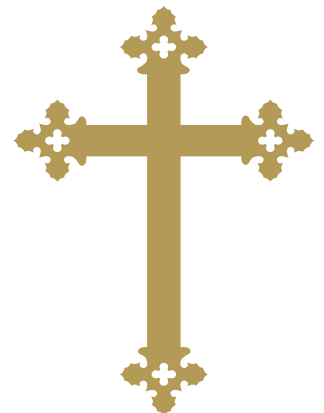
But we can use the Easter Season to solidify and make permanent those virtues we gained throughout Lent. So, what should we do for the Easter Season? I would start with some kind of specific prayer or devotional practice such as praying the Glorious Mysteries of the rosary, or making a Morning Offering each day. Or you could continue delving into the Bible, maybe by reading the New Testament letters of St Paul, St Peter, and St James.

Another thing you could do would be to attend the 4-week class that I’m giving in the month of May. Each Thursday of May I will be digging into the Christian meaning of death and the resurrection of the body. It’s a very interesting and challenging topic that will inspire and motivate you to live a better life. We’ll be talking about life, death, heaven and hell, the funeral liturgy, and the bodily resurrection of the dead and what that means as to how we look at both our life and our death. I highly recommend this class. Each week is an independent lesson, so you can come to whatever one you want or can.

Also, a great way to continue the spirit of prayer you’ve worked on during Lent would be to come to the Saturday morning prayer group at Holy Trinity. Each Saturday at 6:45 am, we meet in church and pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Church. It usually takes about a half an hour to do. Then we go for coffee at one of the spots in Coldwater or Celina. It is meant for just men, but I don’t think they’d mind if women attended as well. Through this prayer group, you can devote a regular time dedicated to praying each week. There is a phone app, iBreviary, that you can download for free and use for this prayer group. It’s a great way to kick-start your Saturdays and give the Lord some of your time each week to praise Him and pray with and for the Church.

So, let’s not waste what we have gained by our Lenten observances. Let’s sail ahead in our spiritual lives by doing something specific this Easter Season.

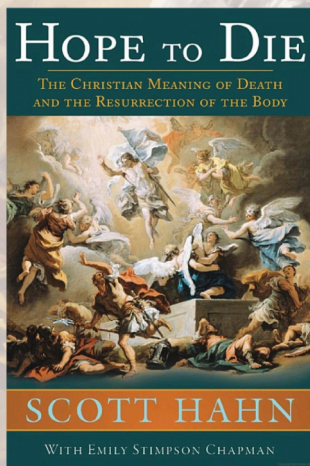

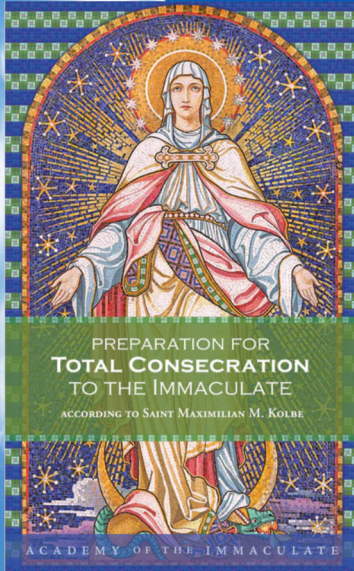
WHAT IS GOD'S MISSION FOR YOU?

Saints of the Week - St. Philip & James, Apostles

Call Philip the gospel's "Answer Man." "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nathaniel asked Philip, who had proclaimed Jesus "the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets" (John 1:45). Jesus asked Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" (John 6:5). Greeks brought Philip their request: "We would like to see Jesus" (John 12:21). Philip's answer to each question: bring people to Jesus! At the Last Supper, finally, Philip had a request of his own: "Show us the Father!" (John 14:8). Jesus had three last questions for Philip: "You still don't know me? How can you ask that? Don't you believe?" And an answer: "I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (John 14:10). Today's James is not John's brother, Zebedee's son, but, tradition says, author of the New Testament Letter of James, who died praying for his murderers in Jesus' words: "Forgive them, for they know not what they do." Few historical details for either saint, but lessons aplenty: Bring every question we have and everybody we meet to Jesus; be, as James' letter challenges, "doers of the word and not hearers only" (James 1:22). — Peter Scagnelli



St. Catherine of Siena

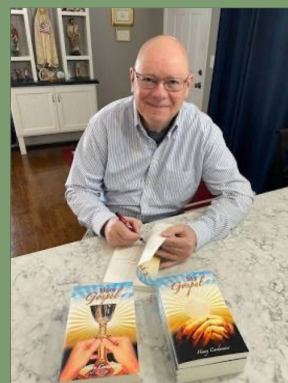
Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as "my sweet Christ on earth," then orders: "Get back to Rome where you belong!" Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in "spiritual espousal" to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of "passing on to others the fruits of contemplation," Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called "my 'Divine Spouse,'" she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women "doctors of the Church." — Peter Scagnelli
