#### IS THERE LIFE AFTER DEATH?

What if it all ends after we die. What if it all goes black, nothing more, end of our existence; just rotting, lifeless flesh and bones in the ground; the end? What would that mean for the short span of years we have on this Earth?

We have been studying this in my Thursday night class during the month of May based on the book, <u>Hope to Die: The Christian Meaning of Death and the Resurrection of the Body</u>, by Catholic author, Scott Hahn. I highly recommend this book for spiritual reading. The class has sparked some good discussion on this existential theme. Of course, it's a subject that affects everyone.

On one hand, if there is nothing after death, it could mean an all-out drive to enjoy every minute of our existence. Eat, drink and be merry, for tomorrow we die, as the saying goes. This is the definition of hedonism. To live for today and get as much pleasure out of it as you can. Unfortunately, your belly gets full, you get tired, you get drunk (and the hangover is not a good time!). There is a natural limit to pleasure. And this inevitably brings sadness and despair. What is the meaning of life if it all doesn't really satisfy your appetites, if it doesn't really fulfill your deepest desires?

We could then take the humanitarian route. If life is short and all ends after death except for the collective memory of the one who passes away, we could do all we can for humanity and thereby be remembered for ages to come. This is a noble thought, but it falls short. We have an insatiable desire for more, for total fulfillment, for lasting peace and everlasting life. This deep desire is built into our mode of being, and touches the deepest core of who we are as human beings. If there is nothing else after death, and we are no more after we die, then why have any concern for what comes after us on Earth; it won't make a bit of difference to our own destiny. Just to be remembered doesn't satisfy these profound longings for more. In time you will inevitably be forgotten anyway. To live a life of sacrifice for others and not receive a "reward" of some sort just isn't worth it.

So, now we get to the heart of the problem. Why would evolution bring us to a desire for more – really, a longing for the infinite, the perfect, the divine – and not let us experience it? How unfair is Mother Nature! What a cruel result of unguided, random mutation and survival of the fittest! It can't be that way.

The most reasonable conclusion is that there is more after death; that we live on in a real way in the next life. People in every age of history have had a concept and belief in the afterlife in some way or another. Only modern man has relegated it to the mythical or imaginary level of the human psyche. But that doesn't make sense. We are made for more. We have a mind, a spirit, which can experience the spiritual side of life – truth, hope, beauty, love. We get glimpses of the divine among us. And the Divine has made contact with us by the revelation of His existence and nature through the Incarnate Son of God, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

So, when thoughts that there is no life after death enter your head, just look into your heart of hearts and reflect on the inescapable truth that we long for more, for the infinite, for total fulfillment, for God; then encounter Him who made you for Himself, and, being faithful to Him, enjoy His presence, now and for all eternity. Amen.



#### Saint of the Week - St. Philip Neri

Philip Neri was a sign of contradiction, combining popularity with piety against the background of a corrupt Rome and a disinterested clergy: the whole post-Renaissance malaise. At an early age, Philip abandoned the chance to become a businessman, moved to Rome from Florence, and devoted his life and individuality to God. After three years of philosophy and theology studies, he gave up any thought of ordination. The next 13 years were spent in a vocation



unusual at the time—that of a layperson actively engaged in prayer and the apostolate. As the Council of Trent (1545-63) was reforming the Church on a doctrinal level, Philip's appealing personality was winning him friends from all levels of society, from beggars to cardinals. He rapidly gathered around himself a group of laypersons won over by his audacious spirituality. Initially, they met as an informal prayer and discussion group, and also served poor people in Rome. At the urging of his confessor, Philip was ordained a priest and soon became an outstanding confessor himself, gifted with the knack of piercing the pretenses and illusions of others, though always in a charitable manner and often with a joke. He arranged talks, discussions, and prayers for his penitents in a room above the church. He sometimes led "excursions" to other churches, often with music and a picnic on the way. Some of Philip's followers became priests and lived together in community. This was the beginning of the Oratory, the religious institute he founded. A feature of their life was a daily afternoon service of four informal talks, with vernacular hymns and prayers. Giovanni Palestrina was one of Philip's followers, and composed music for the services. The Oratory was finally approved after suffering through a period of accusations of being an assembly of heretics, where laypersons preached and sang vernacular hymns! Philip's advice was sought by many of the prominent figures of his day. He is one of the influential figures of the Counter-Reformation, mainly for converting to personal holiness many of the influential people within the Church itself. His characteristic virtues were humility and gaiety. After spending a day hearing confessions and receiving visitors, Philip Neri suffered a hemorrhage and died on the feast of Corpus Christi in 1595. He was beatified in 1615 and canonized in 1622. Three centuries later, Cardinal John Henry Newman founded the first English-speaking house of the Oratory in London.


