



### The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of 1. obligation and rest from servile labor.

You shall confess your sins at least once a year. 2.

You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion 3. at least once a year during the Easter Season.

You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and 4. abstinence established by the Church.

- You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church. 5.
- You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage. 6.

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony involves more than just "booking" a particular date for a wedding. Please keep in mind that church dates are limited. It is highly recommended to book the church when booking your reception hall. Also, since the marriage preparation process usually takes several months to complete, please contact the Family Office at least nine months in advance to start the marriage preparation process.

#### How to Pray the Rosary

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.

2. Pray the Apostles' Creed while holding the Crucifix.

3. On the first bead, pray an Our Father.

4. Pray one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads.

5. Pray the Glory Be followed by the Fatima Prayer.

6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery then Pray the Our Father.

7. For each set of ten beads, Pray ten Hail Marys while meditating on the Mystery.

8. After finishing each decade, Pray the Glory Be followed by the Fatima Prayer.

9. After the five decades are completed, Pray the The Salve Regina followed by the Rosary Prayer and then the St. Michael Prayer.

#### **Apostles' Creed**

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. 



Saint of the Week - St. Charles Lwanga & his companions

"Master of Pages," reputedly the handsomest man in all Uganda, Charles Lwanga, lay catechist, courageously led about forty teenaged boys, Catholics and Anglicans, on a forty-mile forced march to martyrdom for their common Christian faith. Teaching each other the hymns of their different churches, they strengthened one another for the ordeal ahead. King Mwanga, himself barely twenty, had ordered them executed for being "those who pray." But



executed for being "those who pray." But these royal pages were the king's male harem, who, now Christians, refused what pious accounts demurely describe as his "unreasonable demands." Some were clubbed to death, most burned alive; the youngest, thirteen-year old Saint Kizito, whom Charles had often shielded from the King's lust; the most tragic, Saint Mbaga, whose father was his executioner! In 1964, Paul VI canonized the young Catholics and praised their Anglican companions, recalling the heroism of early Christianity's African martyrs, which we modern Christians of far less faith never expected to see repeated. Forty years after the pope's words, what does our faith cost us? Heroism aside, how generous is our response?


