Corpus Christi is Coming Up!

The Sundays after Pentecost are quite interesting. Easter, as many of you know, is not a single day for us as Catholics, but because it is such a rich and pivotal event, the Church spends 50 days unpacking the mystery. All of this culminates with the Feast of Pentecost (which we celebrated last week). On the 50th day after Easter, the Apostles were gathered in the Upper Room with Mary when the Holy Spirit came and filled the Apostles with the grace and apostolic zeal to preach Jesus Christ crucified and risen from the dead to the corners of the world. Pentecost signals the official end of the Easter season because it completes what Easter started: a revolution of God's love being brought into the world.



With Pentecost and the end of the Easter season, the Church settles back into Ordinary Time. And yet, the Sundays of Ordinary Time are anything but ordinary. Rather, almost like waves of the ocean crashing against the shore, the waves of God's incredible graces continue to crash into our lives on the Sundays of Ordinary Time. Each of these waves are mysteries of God which lead us to salvation: that God is one God, yet three Persons (the Trinity); that Jesus Christ is the King of both Heaven and Earth (celebrated at the end of Ordinary Time, usually around the end of October). This next week though, we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the feast of Christ's most holy Body and Blood which we receive in Communion.

In order to prepare for this feast day, we will be having extra hours of adoration--including through the night--beginning Friday, June 20 with Mass at Noon until Sunday, June 22 at 2pm. St. Anthony is graciously hosting this year's 40 Hours devotion. Over the course of those three days, we will have the opportunity to adore Jesus in Holy Communion.

But we're going to need your help to do it! Many of you have already signed up for an hour or split an hour with someone else. Thank you to those that have committed that time to our Lord! Remember: He will never be outdone in generosity! That being said, we still have plenty of room for you. Our hope is to have each hour covered by at least one member of each of our 7 parishes. This way, at every hour, each of our parishes will be represented as we adore our God and King. This will culminate with some final prayers at 2pm on Sunday.

If you have not signed up for some time, please consider doing so. We need to have people there for every hour, and we would love it if we could have someone representing each parish for each hour. But even if you don't sign up, please still come when you can! The more people adoring our Lord, the more He will pour His graces into our parishes and into our lives! Jesus Christ lives among us in the Eucharist for one very simple reason: He thirsts for you and thirsts to give you His love, His grace, and His mercy. He's waiting for you to come and receive it.

So will you come?

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony involves more than just "booking" a particular date for a wedding. Please keep in mind that church dates are limited. It is highly recommended to book the church when booking your reception hall. Also, since the marriage preparation process usually takes several months to complete, please contact the Family Office at least nine months in advance to start the marriage preparation process.

Baptismal Sponsors

This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.





The pews will remain as they are, and we will be placing seals on the entrance doors for improved maintenance and preservation. The confessional will also remain unchanged. 



"God so loved the world," declares John 3:16. "Do not love the world," warns 1 John 2:15. The "world" to love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God's children all. The "world" to flee: "sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life" (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald's conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his



privileged world, Romuald sought God's world in monastic life. Its winding turns and several dead ends make Romuald's journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit's solitary struggle and community life's unique challenges shaped Romuald's legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California—in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe integrate Romuald's experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still.
