Highlights from the Fiscal Year

As many of you know, July 1st begins the new fiscal year. Some of the staff and I are busy running analyses on last year's numbers as we use them to finish generating our budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. While each parish has its own financial strengths and weaknesses, I want to highlight just a few general considerations that we are finding across the board.

Generally, **Sunday collections are up this year**. Thank you all so much for supporting your parish! These donations allow us to keep the lights on, pay the staff, order supplies, and feed and water the priests so that we can all work together to build up God's Kingdom in our little corner of Mercer County.

Just a friendly reminder that, if you want your donations to go to a certain parish, **if you use your parish envelope or label any envelope, that money must go to whichever parish you indicate**. This is not a matter of my personal judgement or parish policy but is a matter of law. If someone came to our parishes from Texas and labeled an envelope with the proper information, we are legally obligated to send that money to that parish in Texas and vice versa! So even if you're unable to make the Mass time work for a particular parish, if you still want to support that parish, simply make sure it says so on the envelope, drop it in the basket, and it will get there. And when you do so, remember the poor widow in the Gospel: all she gave was two small coins, but she gave it with all her heart and the Lord loved her for it. May God bless and reward you for your contributions to the parish, both big and small, time, talent, and treasure. He will never be outdone in generosity!



Related to the Sunday collections is the fact that **Mass attendance continues to be up**. Our Mass attendance across our family of parishes has risen by over 500 people since 2022 and, while those numbers are officially tabulated in October, by every available metric we anticipate seeing those numbers continue to rise! If you are attending Holy Cross parishes regularly and would like to register, you are welcome and encouraged to do so. Simply call the office or visit our website. Parish registration isn't just a formality but is an important way to give a more definitive yes to God by committing to supporting His work in your home parish.

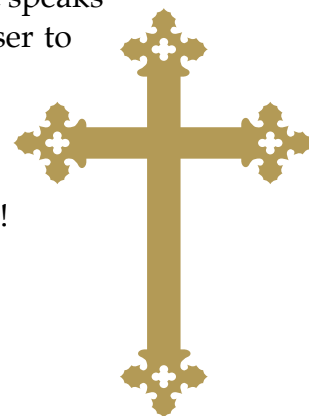
Speaking of Sacraments, **Confession counts continue to rise**. This year, we heard 11,746 Confessions in our parishes (+602 from last year). Please remember that one of the precepts of the Church is to go to Confession at least once a year or to go to Confession before receiving Holy Communion if we have committed a serious, mortal sin. Trust me when I say that Confession can be such a game changer in our spiritual life; don't miss your opportunity to be healed by God's merciful love!

So many people have told me that they notice that there are more opportunities to grow in faith in our parishes than ever before! The staff, volunteers, and priests are working hard to make this so. If there is anything you would like to start here at our parishes, come and talk to us! Some of our best stuff was started because someone sitting in the pews was called by God to do something. He speaks to us in our prayer. Is there anything He's calling you to do to help us grow closer to Him?

More information will be coming because we value financial transparency. We want to make sure that we are using the money entrusted to us for the glory of God and the salvation of souls, so your feedback or questions are always welcome!

SCAM WARNING — Please Ignore any Email, Phone, or Text messages supposedly from Fr. Witt asking you to purchase anything. These are Fraudulent messages from someone trying to Scam Parishioners. Also, AI can be used to fake phone numbers, email addresses, and other forms of communication. Please be aware if you are being asked for personal information, especially in association with financial inquiries. These are more than likely fraudulent. We have especially been seeing a rise in fraudulent emails.

A LOOSE CASH REMINDER — Since our Family of Parishes has formed, our different policies for loose cash have remained. For those who are unaware, in the Coldwater parishes, wherever the cash is donated is where it will stay — at that particular church. Fort Recovery parishes collect all of the cash, and then divide the cash amongst the parishes, proportional to the number of families that belong to each particular church. If you'd like your money to stay at that church you attended in the Fort Recovery churches (or a church other than the one you attended, for that matter), place your cash in any marked envelope. (It doesn't have to be the envelopes provided to you by your registration, it just has to be marked to go to a particular church, and that's where the money will be sent.) Now that vacation season is among us, this is also a good time to remember that when you go to Mass while on vacation, you can still put your envelope for your home parish in that collection too — anywhere in the world! As long as it has your home parish & parish address listed the money will be sent home!

Reminder from the SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati

With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the *Decree on Child Protection*. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse - Arch. of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. Please direct questions regarding bulletin completion to your parish/school safe environment coordinator.

Saint of the Week - Saint Mary Magdalene

Though her transgressions may have been many, just as abundant was her love for her Lord. Perhaps one of the greatest conversion stories of the New Testament, Mary Magdalene was one from whom seven demons had been expelled, a woman plagued by turmoil. She lived her own type of hell on earth, that is, until Jesus crossed her path one day. She first appears in the Bible accompanying him as he journeyed from one town to the other “preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God”. Her gratitude led her to follow and serve her Lord tirelessly, all the way up to the foot of the cross. She did not abandon him in the face of difficulty, nor did she deny him despite the harsh cruelty all around her. She was one of the few to accompany him, gazing upon his beaten and torn countenance as he took his final breath. Jesus rewarded this loving devotion as she is known in Mark’s account to be the first one to see him after the Resurrection (Mark 16:9). May we follow the example of Saint Mary Magdalene in our unwavering dedication to God, so that at the end of our days we may also declare, “I have seen the Lord!” — Tami Urcia
