

#### It Matters Where A Catholic Gets Married

I always get a kick out of telling couples when they ask me to marry them, I say, "No way! I will never marry you!" After their shock wears off a bit, I would follow with, "I will officially witness your marriage, though." As you probably know, it's the couple themselves who confer the Sacrament of Matrimony to each other when they pronounce their vows publicly in a Catholic church before a priest or a deacon. This is what we call a *valid* Catholic marriage.

Entering a valid marriage is a key part of an authentic Catholic life. Sealing those vows in the marital embrace (after and not before the wedding!) and staying true to those vows "for better or for worse" until "death do you part" is essential to the life of grace and friendship with God for the lay Catholic called to this vocation in life.

Is your marriage valid in the Catholic Church? Don't worry; that is not a trick question. If you were married in a Catholic church, it probably is. I ask because there are Catholics who have been married only civilly or in a Protestant service without a dispensation (an "okay" by the Church). Getting married "outside the Church" puts a Catholic objectively apart from the grace of God. A Catholic must be married in the Catholic Church before a priest or deacon in order to have a valid sacramental marriage. Those who have been divorced and remarried outside the Church are also no longer in communion with the Church and objectively in a state of mortal sin. Although they must continue to fulfill the Sunday obligation and the other precepts of the Church, they shouldn't receive Holy Communion until the situation is rectified.

If a baptized Catholic has been married outside the Church, in a destination wedding for example, at a hotel or on the beach, they must seek to reconcile with the Church and then receive the Sacrament of Marriage.

For those who are divorced and remarried, we have to remember that every marriage is assumed valid until proven otherwise. If they were married in the Catholic Church validly, then divorced and remarried, they must either end the second marriage or seek an *annulment* of that first marriage, in order to make that second marriage valid. An annulment is a declaration of the Church, after a thorough investigation, that a marriage was invalid. There is no longer any cost to getting an annulment, and it can be a healing time for a divorced person.

Also, a Catholic should not attend a wedding of a Catholic person when it is outside the Church. What's worse is for a Catholic to actually officiate a marriage of a fellow Catholic outside the Church. It's fairly easy for anyone to obtain a license to marry people legally. I have heard that this has happened around here. A practicing Catholic should not do this, since they would be leading other Catholics into sin through an invalid marriage.

All this may sound nit-picky and kind of cold. But it is actually a good thing because the Church is extremely intentional that her members truly receive the grace of God through validly and properly celebrated sacraments. Our eternal destiny rides on it. Therefore, the Church wants to do it right.

If you have questions concerning your marriage, please don't hesitate to talk to a priest or deacon. We are more than ready to help. May God bless all of our married couples, especially those who are experiencing difficulties or have gone through a divorce. The Church is there to help you on your way to Heaven.

#### Saint of the Week - Saint Ignatius of Loyola

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Because there were no books of romance on hand during his convalescence, Ignatius whiled away the time reading a life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began. Having seen the Mother of God in a vision, he made a pilgrimage to her shrine at Montserrat near Barcelona. He remained for almost a year at nearby Manresa, sometimes with Dominicans.



sometimes in a pauper's hospice, often in a cave in the hills praying. After a period of great peace of mind, he went through a harrowing trial of scruples. There was no comfort in anything—prayer, fasting, sacraments, penance. At length, his peace of mind returned. It was during this year of conversion that Ignatius began to write down material that later became his greatest work, the Spiritual Exercises. He finally achieved his purpose of going to the Holy Land, but could not remain, as he planned, because of the hostility of the Turks. Ignatius spent the next 11 years in various European universities, studying with great difficulty, beginning almost as a child. Like many others, his orthodoxy was questioned; Ignatius was twice jailed for brief periods. In 1534, at the age of 43, he and six others—one of whom was Saint Francis Xavier—vowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. If this became impossible, they vowed to offer themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The latter became the only choice. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general. When companions were sent on various missions by the pope, Ignatius remained in Rome, consolidating the new venture, but still finding time to found homes for orphans, catechumens, and penitents. He founded the Roman College, intended to be the model of all other colleges of the Society. Ignatius was a true mystic. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity—the Trinity, Christ, the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, Ad majorem Dei gloriam—"for the greater glory of God." In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of his men. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls.
