Have You Found God's Plan for Your Life?

Where did the summer go? School has begun again already; good for some (like parents wanting to get their kids out of the house) and terrible for others (like the kids who have to be locked up and in their seats for torturous hours of class, and for the teachers who have to put up with those kids once again).

When I was in eighth grade, I wanted nothing else than to be in high school. When I was in high school, I wanted nothing else than to be out of high school and onto college. Not that I didn't like school; I always got good grades and played sports, edited the school paper, loved woodworking shop, and the chili and peanut butter sandwiches they had for lunch on Fridays. I also loved to play euchre during lunch break every day.

But in high school I was never where I wanted to be; there was always something out there waiting for me to do. I was friends with everybody but had no real close friends all through high school. I was, though, very close to my cousins and was growing in my faith. I was like a traveler passing through the halls of Minster High School, not knowing what was to come next.

Eventually I would find where I was to be in life, God's plan for my life, my vocation to the priesthood, and I thank God for making it known to me and leading me to it. We are on a pilgrimage in this life, a journey to find our place, our vocation, and, really, our true home. We're not there yet. Just like high school or even college, which are just steps along the way, we are in transition. Our task is to find where God wants us to be – God's will for our lives. We don't want to take our current position lightly, however. We have to pour our heart and soul into whatever is before us. But we have to keep our eyes on the goal, keeping a wider perspective on life, not doing anything that will get in the way of reaching that goal. We have to not look for what I selfishly want, but what God wants.

What is God's will for us? To be with Him forever in heaven, and to get ready here on earth for that eternal union with Him. In other words, God wants us to be happy for all eternity. This true happiness can only come about if we willingly suffer through the trials and difficulties of life and love authentically, both God and our neighbor. That's why it is so important to pray and go to church regularly. We need to stay connected to God. We need that support. So, let's keep our eyes on the goal and keep working to reach it, doing God's will.

And let's continue to pray for our young men who are being called to the priesthood for our archdiocese. God knows we need more priests. Pray then that they have the courage to offer their lives in service of Christ and his Church. St. John Vianney, pray for us and for many priestly vocations!

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
- 6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.

Saint of the Week - Saint Monica

She had smiles for the neighbors, though her husband found her religion and the charity it inspired annoying. She made tearful prayers in private for a son, outwardly self-assured but, as his mother knew, inwardly restless, and whose girlfriend of a dozen years had borne his child out of wedlock. Though not the first or last such mother and son, Monica and Augustine are the Church's most famous, so we keep their feast days back to back, with Monica's, fittingly, first. To Rome she



followed Augustine, then to Milan, where years of prayer-and nagging—finally bore fruit in his conversion by Saint Ambrose. For six months, mother and son enjoyed the blessing of rediscovering each other. Just in time! On the way home to North Africa, Monica took sick and died near Rome. No child who has mourned a parent can read, unmoved, Augustine's tender account, in his Confessions, of Monica's last days. At this time of the year, when parents watch apprehensively as children leave for school, may Monica's perseverance and Augustine's long-prayed-for conversion ease anxiety and kindle hope. -Peter Scagnelli


