Exciting Opportunities!

Cultivating vocations--to the priesthood for our men and religious sisters for our women--is one of the most important things I can work towards as a priest and that we need to work towards as a community. Priests and religious sisters do not come from nowhere; they come from families like yours and mine. However, there can be a lot of fear when it comes to vocations. The men and women being called might be afraid of loneliness from lack of a spouse. They might be afraid of the difficulty of the work or the rejection they might face from their peers. Parents (and even



grandparents) can also be afraid at the thought of their kids being called to a vocation. To all of these fears, we can only remember the words of Sacred Scripture, the words repeated 365 times throughout the Bible to signify our daily reminder: *Be Not Afraid!*

For me, the priesthood has been nothing short of a total joy, even amidst the crosses that I experience and am asked by my Lord to carry. I entered seminary with some of the fears listed above, but within days of being there, I watched amazed as, one by one, the Lord took those fears and showed me that He was going to provide for me. He has taken infinitely better care of me than I could ever have taken care of myself. He has fulfilled me more than I thought possible. There really is nothing to fear if God is calling you (or your child) to these states in life!

Andrew Dinners and Bethany Brunches

To help dispel some of these fears, the Archdiocese is providing two opportunities to help men and women who might be called to these incredible vocations. Last year, the new vocations director (Fr. Mike Willig) reinstituted the *Andrew Dinners* which are dinners for men to come together and hear about what life is like as a seminarian and a priest and to ask any questions they might have. Last year, we took 14 men from our parishes to this dinner. Not all of them will be called to the priesthood, but every Wednesday, the priests get together to pray that at least some of them will be called. Who knows, maybe some of them will even be called to serve back home one of these days?

This year, Holy Cross Family of Parishes has been asked to host a brand new event called *Bethany Brunches*. Similar to the *Andrew Dinners*, *Bethany Brunches* will be an opportunity for women to come together and meet some religious sisters, hear about what their life is like, and to ask any questions that might be weighing on them.

I want to challenge any young woman that can to come to this brunch. One of the reasons I agreed to host it (other than being passionate about cultivating more religious sisters) is because one of the difficulties of being a Catholic woman today is that they no longer get to see what a religious sister is like. While the men are blessed with the 6 daily examples of what it might be like for them to serve the Church (4 priests and 2 deacons), for many of our young women, religious sisters are more like a fairy tale from times long past rather than the model of authentic Catholic femininity that they should be in our


parishes. Even if you are not called to religious life, come and meet these sisters and hear about the possibilities that God could be calling you to. We need priestly vocations. Without the Sacraments, we have nothing. But we need religious sisters, too, and we need them desperately! They contribute so much to the Church and, until we have them back in our parishes, we will never truly flourish any more than a home can flourish without a woman. Fathers will always provide, just like the priests do for their parishes, but mothers--religious sisters in the parish context--are what transform a house into a home!

One final note

Congratulations and prayers for the parishioners of St. Joe's and St. Mary's who are celebrating the foundings of their parishes this weekend. St. Joe's is celebrating YEARS) and St. Mary's is celebrating 149 years. Praise God for such good work He has done because of these parishes!



Book of the Month Jesus the Bridegroom: by Brant Pitre

Book Review by: Trent Pearson



This book was one of those books I often looked over as "not for me". I now recommend it to those who are looking for a deeper relationship with Christ, especially in the Eucharist. Brant Pitre walks through scripture revealing how the Jews of Christ time would of recognized Jesus' actions and why the gospel authors inspired by the Holy Spirit wrote them the way they did. God was looking for his bride and this book walks through the tradition of a Jewish marriage and how those customs were God's plan for His bride, the church, which is every one of us. I like to take a pearl from every book I read, and this book for me had so many. We will never know God's heart until we turn our hearts toward His; that takes time and humility. This book, I believe, can possibly take us to that next level of warmth of familiarity. It was very readable for me, not too heady. I believe anyone who is familiar with scripture will enjoy. If you are not familiar with scripture, it will give you a reason to pull the Bible out and let God reveal his love for you.



LOCAL RESOURCES AND SUPPORT AVAILABLE

- Hogenkamp and Brockman Boeckman funeral homes can be contacted at anytime for a pregnancy loss. Both will provide FREE burial materials, grave preparation, hospital pick up of remains, and coordination of any clergy/graveside needs if a pregnancy loss is under 20 weeks. In addition, both funeral homes provide donated grave digging for burial on existing graves of deceased family members and updated marking on cemetery plot maps for all cemeteries in our Family of Parishes. They also provide cost-friendly options for burial of full term babies in separate graves. These options allow families to lay their children to rest in our local cemeteries.
- Miscarriage kits are available upon request from Mercer Health OB offices during their normal business hours and the ER. Morgan's Place Cemetery also has a kit delivery option.
- Morgan's Place Cemetery in Shelby County and Heaven's Gain Ministries in Cincinnati provide free and/or low cost burial services for infants of all gestational ages and stillborns.
- Knights of Columbus offers a NO COST Family Fraternal Benefit for stillborns over 20 weeks gestation which is available for insured members that have a minimum of one existing life insurance policy that has a payment of \$5,000 and up to \$10,000 for the death of any child under age 18. Saint of the Week - Saint John Chrysostom

"Speaking truth to power" may have become just another cliché, but doing precisely that cost John "the Golden Mouth" (Chrysostom) his diocese and, after exile and a forced march, his health and life. "Renowned for eloquence, heroic in suffering" (Sacramentary), John's scriptural insights still comfort and challenge. Mystical theologian, he bids Eastern Christians, whose principal Divine Liturgy bears his name, to lift up their hearts to "God ineffable, beyond comprehension, invisible, beyond understanding, existing forever, always the same." Model pastor, he warns Roman Catholics in the Liturgy of the Hours not to neglect God-inthe-flesh: "Would you honor Christ's body? Do not scorn his nakedness,



honoring him here in church with silken robes, while neglecting him cold and naked outside. What use to burden Christ's altar with golden chalices, while Christ himself starves to death? What use dressing the altar with gold-woven cloths, while denying the shivering Christ the clothes he needs? Do not adorn the church while ignoring your needy brother: he is the most precious temple of all!" —Peter Scagnelli


