As of last Sunday, September 7th our Holy Catholic Church canonized 2 brand new saints: Pier Giorgio Frassati & Carlo Acutis. These 2 Holy Studs reign from the country of Italy and are worthy of a full on emoji demonstration of GLORY which will be attempted here and now:

St. Pier Giorgio Frassati 🧗 🥫 🕺 🥸 🤣 🦥 🎶 🚵 💝 🚵 🎶 💨 🤣 🥸 🕺 🥫

Says it all right !?! Allow me to interpret...Pier was only 24 years old when he died on July 4th 1925. He was born into a fairly well-to-do family. His father Alfredo (like the sauce) owned THE local newspaper called La Stampa. Although Frassati grew up in wealth, he was a man of the poor. There are countless stories of times when Pier would show up home late, missing clothing because he found somone on the streets of Turin who needed it more than he did. Pier was an avid adventurer! He loved to hike , camp of, and revel in the outdoors for any and all who had died or lost their way there. Pier was a sucker for a good prank. He was constantly making his friends laugh through his various shenanigans like having ice cream delivered during school exams! More than anything PGF (short for his full name) loved Jesus he would spend much of his day outside of work in prayer or in service to the lost, lonely, and forgotten. To ensure he would wake up early in order to make it to morning Mass after spending most of the night caring for the homeless, he would tie a rope around his ankle and dangle it outside his window so the first worker to come to his parents estate would tug on it to startle him to get going. Pier died young as the result of a disease called polio. His parents were shocked when literally 1,000s of street people came to his funeral.

I mean you get it Carlo was born in the 90s just like a bunch of YOU young guns out there (being a man of the 80s myself). Over his 15 short years of life on earth this guy proved to be a true Italian Stallion for the Kingdom !From a very young age Carlo seemed unique. Instead of spending more time the beach for he would go to church with the older ladies and pray the rosary Acutis enjoyed playing videos games like Mario and Pokémon. Yet, being a modern man, Carlo used his skills to highlight the bounty of the Catholic Church's most moving truths captured in Marian Apparitions and Eucharistic Miracles. You can still visit his website today: just type Miracoli Eucharisti into the 'ol GOOGLE. Some are calling him "God's influencer" Certainly Rajesh Mohur, his Hindu nanny converted to the Catholic faith, would agree. It was gentle but steady care and witness to truth and love that moved her to join the Church. As Carlo became sick with Leukemia, he is quoted for offering up his illness for the pope and the Church. One of the saint's great lines was "to always be close to Jesus, that is my life plan".

Sacrament of Matrimony

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony involves more than just "booking" a particular date for a wedding. Please keep in mind that church dates are limited. It is highly recommended to book the church when booking your reception hall. Also, since the marriage preparation process usually takes several months to complete, please contact the Family Office at least nine months in advance to start the marriage preparation process.



The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
- 6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.

Baptismal Sponsors

This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.



Saint of the Week - Saint Cornelius

There was no pope for 14 months after the martyrdom of Saint Fabian because of the intensity of the persecution of the Church. During the interval, the Church was governed by a college of priests. Saint Cyprian, a friend of Cornelius, writes that Cornelius was elected pope "by the judgment of God and of Christ, by the testimony of most of the clergy, by the vote of the people, with the consent of aged priests and of good men." The greatest problem of Saint



Cornelius's two-year term as pope had to do with the Sacrament of Penance and centered on the readmission of Christians who had denied their faith during the time of persecution. Two extremes were finally both condemned. Cyprian, primate of North Africa, appealed to the pope to confirm his stand that the relapsed could be reconciled only by the decision of the bishop. In Rome, however, Saint Cornelius met with the opposite view. After his election, a priest named Novatian (one of those who had governed the Church) had himself consecrated a rival bishop of Rome—one of the first antipopes. He denied that the Church had any power to reconcile not only the apostates, but also those guilty of murder, adultery, fornication, or second marriage! Cornelius had the support of most of the Church (especially of Cyprian of Africa) in condemning Novatianism, though the sect persisted for several centuries. Saint Cornelius held a synod at Rome in 251 and ordered the "relapsed" to be restored to the Church with the usual "medicines of repentance." The friendship of Cornelius and Cyprian was strained for a time when one of Cyprian's rivals made accusations about him. But the problem was cleared up. A document from Cornelius shows the extent of organization in the Church of Rome in the mid-third century: 46 priests, seven deacons, seven subdeacons. It is estimated that the number of Christians totaled about 50,000. He died as a result of the hardships of his exile in what is now Civitavecchia.


