Received by God – Receptive to God

“Hospitality”, “inclusivity”, and “welcome” are all meaningful concepts when understood in their strictly definitional sense...The charity to which all Christians are called should be marked by these qualities, as they preserve us from hostile prejudices and an intolerable intolerance that renders difficult our coming together in the bond of charity, which is the hallmark of Christian living. *“How good and how pleasant it is when brothers live in unity”* (Psalm 133:1). **Yet, just as our understanding of charity has suffered grave distortions in our modern world, these qualities of charity have likewise been distorted...**This is an important framing of the problem as regards Christian community – i.e. belonging in the Church – because **it is common to grade a community based on whether or not it “makes me feel welcome.”** ...In this climate, we become preoccupied with our subjective feeling of being welcome, and we place the burden upon the community of “making me feel welcome”; and if the community fails to meet our standards of what it feels like to feel welcome, the community has failed and needs to change.

But I wonder if a better starting point might not be this question: *Who must welcome whom?* Who, on a fundamental level, needs to open their heart in welcome? God is love, and as love He never rejects anyone who comes to Him; He loves us from the beginning and He never ceases to love us; God is fundamentally open to each one of us.

... God created us for Heaven; He welcomes us into the Heaven of His love, and this Heaven is open to all, no matter who we are. But we must be conformed to His love and all that it demands – “If you love me, keep my commandments” (John 14:15). Love, like welcome, is not reducible to a feeling or an opinion – it is a reality. If we will not *really* welcome God into our lives, which means welcoming His commandments and the life He calls us to live, if we harbor a *real* hostility of sin in our hearts, it is not God Who fails in hospitality; it is the individual whose sin renders him inhospitable to God. We can say the same thing about His Church.... God offers us His love through His Church; and He...leaves it to us to accept or reject it, whether it is in our words, actions, or simply the cold disinterestedness of our hearts to God's love...

Recently there was an article reporting on a meeting between Fr. James Martin and Pope Leo, where it is claimed that the Holy Father “vows continuity with Pope Francis’ legacy of welcome” to individuals experiencing gender dysphoria or same-sex sexual attraction. The article raises questions about what is meant by welcome, and that’s why I want to focus on this admittedly sensitive and painful subject. I adopt the posture of the Church in this regard, which teaches us that those who suffer from these particular burdens **“must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity”** (CCC 2358) ...which requires the truth of what life in Christ demands and makes possible. **I want to address issues with the article, as it can confuse Catholics, especially those suffering from unwanted homosexual inclinations trying to rely on grace and live virtuously with this cross...and especially those who might seek a revision of the sacred teaching of our Lord and His Church. They do so, in some cases, for what they think are good intentions; but it is often from a misplaced spirit of welcome.** I want to help us see the Church’s vision of what welcome really means.

Fr. James Martin advocates for greater inclusion of so-called LGBTQ+ Catholics in the life of the Church, and he recently met with Pope Leo in a private audience. Fr. Martin is an ambiguous figure, who maintains an unclear position regarding Christian Faith and the cross of homosexual feelings that certain souls carry. Fr. Martin is the founder of a group attempting...to minister to these individuals, but it promotes... problematic ideas regarding human sexuality... **it advocates for the Church to adopt a more inclusive or welcoming posture, which...demands an absolute acceptance of all things, including behaviors at odds with human nature, happiness, and God's plan for our salvation.** This group erroneously claims that Sacred Scripture makes no judgements about homosexual activity or, if it does make judgements, it argues they are fundamentally positive ones, and that the Church's traditional and canonical interpretation of Sacred Scripture in this regard is flawed and outdated, as if God's Word or the Church's interpretation of that Word when it confirms perennial moral truths must adapt to changing sentiments and times...Fr. Martin always leads with this idea that he is an advocate for "LGBTQ+ Catholics". This is fundamentally problematic because no one should define themselves or others according to their temptations or sinful inclinations – whether they be inclined to vanity, greed, gluttony, wrath, envy, sloth, or lust, the individual is not identical with their temptations. It is the same for those who suffer from confusion related to human sexuality: **it is not the burden that defines them, but the freedom offered to them in Christ....**

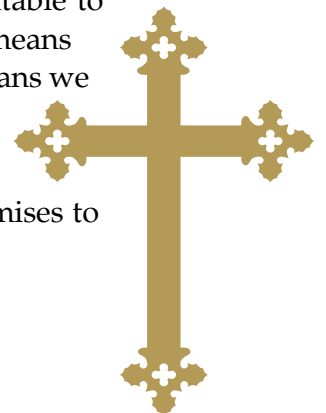
In this article, Fr. Martin is the only source of information, and it is padded by the reporter's personal commentary on this issue. Never once is Pope Leo quoted directly...We do not know what, exactly, was said, just *what Fr. Martin himself heard*. **I am doubtful Pope Leo used the politically charged and anthropologically problematic label of "LGBTQ". Our fundamental identity is that we are children of God, sinners who have been redeemed in Christ, a beloved creation made new in Him.** However, I would absolutely expect Pope Leo wants to welcome all people into the Church, regardless of their struggle, including those who struggle with questions of identity at the level of human sexuality. Why? Because **the Church is the refuge of sinners – and this includes all sinners!**

Every single one of us needs God's mercy...and they are offered to all. **If I am violent, there is mercy for my violence in the Church; if I am greedy, there is mercy for my greed in the Church...mercy for my gossip, mercy for my drunkenness, mercy for my lusts. But receiving that mercy hinges upon whether or not I desire to turn and be healed.** Whatever the brokenness, whatever the wound, whatever the temptation, whatever the sin, the Church is open to all, and she receives all. This is her mission of mercy: that she welcomes sinners back to God...The Church is always welcoming us into this healing....

This brings us back to our original question: Who must welcome whom? We have been welcomed by God, but then we must respond by welcoming Him...**Is God really welcome in my life? It is not enough for the Church to welcome us into God's life if we are not prepared to welcome that life completely into our hearts and souls.** *I write all of this as one who is a fellow sinner, who also needs God's grace, and never stops needing it,* and as one having a deep concern for **an entire population of wounded human beings who are treated as if this kind of welcome is somehow hostile to who they are, or that they cannot achieve conversion of heart or the same holiness any other sinner is called to achieve, or that somehow the life of grace to which Christ calls all of us is fundamentally impossible for them.** A sinner is a sinner is a sinner; all of us, regardless of our particular struggle with sin, are called to conversion, to render our souls more hospitable to God. If our hearts are open to conversion, only then can we experience what it truly means to be welcomed into the divine life of the Most Holy Trinity. To be received by God means we must also become receptive to God, to the fullness of Who He is, and who we are called to become in Him, nothing held back....

Will we open our arms wide to Him, to His Commandments, and the life He promises to those who love Him?

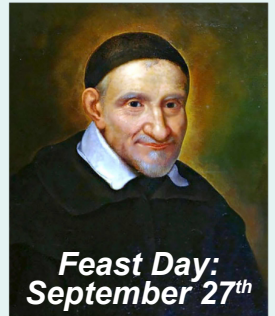

Saint of the Week - Saint Vincent de Paul

St. Vincent de Paul was born in the 16th century and lived on a small farm in Gascony, France. He worked herding his family's livestock as a child and entered seminary at age 15. He was ordained at age 19 but since he was too young to be a pastor, he continued his theological studies. Although he initially hoped priesthood would afford him a comfortable life, he had a change of heart while hearing the confession of a dying servant. From then on, he sought to fulfill the spiritual needs of the poor in France. He eventually became the leader of the Vincentian community, whose members devoted themselves to the service of the poor in small towns and villages. Throughout his life he established confraternities of charity, organized fundraisers for missionary projects, founded hospitals and seminaries, and ransomed slaves. He also had a particular passion for training priests by conducting retreats. Vincent started out as a hard and rough man but became tender and sensitive to others' needs. Let us be uplifted by the example of St. Vincent de Paul, who allowed himself to be transformed by Christ in both character and deeds. May we follow his example and seek to serve those in need in whatever capacity God may be calling us to. —Tami Urcia
