**Dragon Slayer Retreat Information -** January 17th, this is a <u>mandatory retreat</u> for students and parents.

**First Reconciliation** - This will take place in the spring. If this is made outside of the scheduled times, this will need to be communicated with the CRE.

**First Communion Practice -** This will be held the Wednesday prior to the First Communion Mass.

**First Communion Mass -** The Sacrament of First Communion will be held separately at each parish.

Please note that students can receive the Sacraments at any of our 7 parishes as long as it is communicated with the CRE.

#### First Reconciliation

**St. Anthony / St. Mary -** Please arrive before or at the start time of 10 and find a seat in one of the center pews of the church. (This is to avoid hearing individuals in the confessionals.) Once you have received the sacrament of confession please find either your teacher or Sarah for your certificate!

**Holy Trinity -** Please arrive in the Grotto 10 minutes before your scheduled time and sign in. You will receive further instructions from there. Make sure not to leave until you have collected your certificate after receiving the sacrament of confession.

#### **Dress Code**

For our First Communion Masses please follow the following dress code.

Girls: White dress. Veils and accessories are optional and left to family discretion.

**Boys**: White or light colored shirt and tie with dark dress pants (Please avoid loud colors). Jackets are optional.

## **Blessing of Items**

Either the weekend following a parish's First Communion Mass or the weekend after all First Communion Masses, we will offer a special opportunity to have First Communion gifts blessed. This will take place after the same Mass time in which First Communion was celebrated at that parish.

Families may place their items in the church basement or the corresponding school hall either before or immediately after Mass. Items will be grouped into categories, as each type receives its own special blessing. Below is a list of the categories the items will be sorted into:

- Rosaries/ Rosary bracelets
- Miraculous Medals
- St. Benedict Medals / bracelets
- Brown Scapulars
- Images or Statues of Our Lord/Mary/Saints
- Crucifixes
- Everything else (Holy water fonts, candles, etc.)

Please be sure to label your items clearly so they can be returned to the correct family.

### **Mary Crowning**

First Communion mass will be combined with the crowning of Mary. This will take place at the end of Mass, where we will have 1-3 female First Communicants bring up the flower crown and flowers for Father to crown Mary. These students will be chosen by the CRE and 2nd grade teachers. Following this, we will pray a Litany. All attending this Mass are welcome to bring in flowers to leave at the feet of Mary.

#### **Enrollment of the Scapulars**

At the end of Mass, Father will enroll the students in the scapular. Please refrain from moving about the church until after this takes place as our celebration is not complete until the enrollment is complete. All students should wear their scapular for the group photo following Mass. Below is a brief look into why we have scapulars and their history.

#### **Scapular History**

The scapular, the two small pieces of wool most people think of when they hear the word, is a sacramental based on the habit worn by the monks of the St. Benedictine order. A true scapular, in the original use of the word, is a piece of cloth, about shoulder width, that is worn over the shoulders and falls not quite to the wearer's feet.

In the middle ages, it was common for the lay faithful to join religious orders in an affiliate sense, as a tertiary. Since some did not take full vows, they would not wear the full habit. The non-monastic, one not taking full vows, would be granted a "reduced scapular" to wear. This was two pieces of wool, about 2 inches by 3 inches each, held together by a band or cord and worn over the shoulder with one rectangle in front and one in back. Still larger than the devotional scapular worn by many Catholics, the shape and small size of this scapular is closest in appearance to what many lay Catholics wear. They are still often worn by tertiary members of the Franciscan, Carmelite, and Dominican orders.

#### Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Also called simply the Brown Scapular, this small scapular is the most well-known and likely the earliest form of the devotional scapular. Tradition holds that the Blessed Virgin appeared to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251 in England, with a scapular in her hand and said to him:

"Take, beloved son this scapular of thy order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant."

Although it may be worn by any Catholic, even an infant, the investiture must be done by a priest, and the scapular must be worn in the proper manner. The Catholic Church has approved eighteen different kinds of scapulars of which the best known is the woolen brown scapular, or the Scapular of Mount Carmel, that the Virgin Mary bestowed on Simon Stock. His feast day is May 16th.

## **Group Photo**

Directly following the events of Mass, we will line students up for a group photo. We ask that all families refrain from taking photos until the church assigned photographer is finished. From there we will keep students lined up for no more than 5 minutes for everyone to take their personal photos. Once we release students you are welcome to leave or take photos around the church grounds.

## **Dragon Slayer Retreat**

On Saturday, **January 17th**, all second grade students and a parent will be attending the First Communion Retreat. This retreat will be held at the **Coldwater High School** from **9:00 am-12:00 pm**. Registration will begin at 8:30 am and donuts and drinks will be provided.

The retreat will be led by Dr. John Wood and his wife, Kristin, who give this presentation all over the country! In the second hour of the retreat, while the kids are having their own session, John Wood will be offering a presentation specifically for the parents. John has spoken at hundreds of parishes and schools across the country, and his book, "Ordinary Lives, Extraordinary Mission," has sold over 240,000 copies. New York Times Bestselling author Matthew Kelly has said, "I believe John is one of the great emerging Catholic voices of our time.
