

AI Pope?

A few months after his election, I think I've finally gotten to the point where it feels natural to say "for Leo, our pope" during the Eucharistic Prayer. For me, that's what makes it feel so official: we have a new pope! It's been a lot of fun watching him and listening to his homilies. He seems like a good man. But I, like many others, are also wondering, what kind of a pope is Pope Leo going to be?

One of the first things people started to compare about Leo XIV with the previous pope who held the name Leo (Leo XIII who reigned from 1878-1903) is that they both came to the papal throne in the midst of major economic revolutions: Pope Leo XIII heroically led the faithful through the Industrial Revolution, emphasizing the need to protect human rights and the worker; that the worker is not just a cog in a machine, but a person who should be respected; that the best way to respect a worker was to allow him or her time to flourish as a human person, especially in their relationship with God and family; family, not work and certainly not the individual,



is the basic building block of society. Many wonder, as we stand at the beginning of a new revolution: the AI Revolution, how Pope Leo will lead us to understand this new technology and how he envisions it fitting into the life of a faithful Catholic.

What to expect?

I'm really hopeful that the Holy Father will issue guidelines and teachings about this new technology. He has spoken about AI quite often in homilies and addresses. He's aware of the issues and thinks about them quite deeply. I think that, when he formally addresses the issue, it will be well worth listening to what he has to say. But if I had to predict what he would say, I would go back to a good rule of thumb we often use when it comes to medical technology. If a technology aids the natural process or functioning, it can often be considered licit (able to be used). If a technology replaces the natural process or functioning, it is often considered illicit (unable to be used). Think about a student completing homework (or, for that matter, a priest writing a homily). A licit use of AI when completing work like this would be to use it to find sources, to aid in the research. An illicit use would be to have AI write it for you.

One of the *best* uses of AI I've heard about so far is that an AI model was used to create prediction models which were able to forecast a diagnosis of breast cancer 5 years earlier than previous methods. That's an awesome use of AI! One of the worst uses I've heard about is that AI, especially "AI Art" has been used to create impure images of people, often classmates. This is obviously violative and parents need to be sure to protect and instruct their kids in this regard.

Double-Entondra

Another illicit use of AI that I've seen is using AI to fabricate material and attribute it to someone. Almost immediately after Pope Leo's election, Youtube channels sprang up with homilies, allegedly given by Pope Leo when he was a bishop in Peru. Using AI to recreate his voice, someone used AI to "write" homilies which they attributed to the new pontiff and posted on Youtube for clicks. In a way, many people's first introduction to Pope Leo was not himself, but through an AI Pope! It's important, especially as we evaluate the morality of this new technology, that we go in eyes-wide-open for scams like this. AI telemarketers are already a thing, preying on the elderly and well-meaning. Young people, who are often better-versed with technologies, should be sure to alert elderly parents or grandparents about things like this.

Take-Away

At the end of the day, AI, like all technology, has the potential to bring out the best in humanity...or the worst. I've given some general guidance here, but I know that when Pope Leo speaks about this, it's important that Catholics listen with an obedient and attentive heart. The Devil will always want to trick

us, to downplay the possible evil for the sake of the possible benefits. "He is prowling like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour" (see I Peter 5:8). But this is why Christ gave us His Church, guided by His vicar. Let's pray for Pope Leo, asking God for the grace he needs to be a good shepherd who leads us to Heaven and teaches uswith AI as with all things--to "resist the Devil, firm in our faith" (see I Peter 5:9)!

Book of the Month

The Soul of the Apostolate: by Jean-Baptiste Chautard, O.C.S.O



The phrase "Spiritual Classic" will capture the attention of any catholic reader who is searching for their next (or first) book to commit to. Titles like The Imitation of Christ, Interior Castle, and Confessions are all well-established classics; The Soul of the Apostolate deserves its place in that category as well. Written by a French Trappist monk near the turn of the 20th century, this book will stoke your desire to develop a rich and lasting prayer life.

The Soul of the Apostolate firmly declares the primacy of our interior lives. While our active life (the love of neighbor) is integral to every Christian, it should never become more important than our contemplative life (love of God). Although the principal audience for the book was priests and religious, every page is applicable to the lay person.

I would suggest beginning with the appendix, where the author gives "Ten Aids to Mental Prayer". These aids are incredibly practical. Then, as you begin to apply yourself to consistent prayer, read from the beginning. Prepare to be challenged and encouraged while developing an interior life you have always longed for.




Saint of the Week - Pope Saint John XXIII

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was an ordinary man who achieved extraordinary things in the 20th century. Born into a farming family in northern Italy, he joined the Secular Franciscan order and served in Rome in various capacities following his ordination. During World War II, his diplomacy helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people. He was named a cardinal in 1953, and later elected pope, taking the name John after his father and St. John Lateran. Pope John soon became famous for his wit and he



began meeting with world political and religious leaders. His writings include "Mother and Teacher" (1961) and "Peace on Earth" (1963). He enlarged the College of Cardinals, making it more international. He opened the Second Vatican Council and set the tone for it stating "...the Spouse of Christ prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than that of severity." He is nicknamed "Good Pope John". May Pope Saint John XXIII encourage us by his teachings and example, to understand the Gospel better and to understand each other better. — Tamii Urcia


