Another Triduum

Every year, we celebrate the Sacred Triduum, the three days on which we remember the Pascal Mystery, namely, the institution of the Sacred Eucharist and Priesthood (Holy Thursday), the Death (Good Friday), and the Resurrection (Easter) of our Lord Jesus Christ. These three days are incredibly sacred to us as Catholics. But did you know that there is another triduum that we celebrate throughout the year?

This weekend is that other triduum. These three days, instead of commemorating our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, commemorate the three possible destinies of our Souls: Hell (All Hallow's Eve, or Halloween), Heaven (All Saints Day, November 1st), and Purgatory (All Souls Day, November 2nd).

Halloween, which is often represented by deathly and deadly décor (though Catholics avoid demonic decor), represents the death of the soul through sin which results in Hell. This state of the soul is "commemorated" first because in the light of God's salvation, the powers of Hell and the things of Hell flee in terror at the rising dawn of Christ's triumphal conquest of death in His Resurrection. Traditionally, the vigil for the Solemnity would be marked by spiritual preparation: *prayer, fasting, and almsgiving* (as well as preparing for a feast to celebrate the Solemnity!). Christ has already won the victory (John 16:33)! Armed with these Heavenly weapons, Catholics can confidently stride through the darkness of this world, which we call this "vale of tears" because for now, this world is in league with the Devil and the powers of Hell. But we do not fear the world because by our Baptism we have been enlightened by Christ and can walk unafraid into the marvelous light of Heaven.



After the armies of Hell have fled in terror comes the marvelous light of All Saints Day. Instead of the dreary decor, the Church assembles (it's normally a Holy Day of Obligation) and her ministers process in wearing golden robes of glory (see Psalm 104 and Revelation 19). In the midst of the Church, we reflect on the great saints, both those known and unknown. These men and women are in Heaven because they lived a life conformed to Jesus Christ or were purified through the bath of Purgatory. These are the men and women who give us the greatest confidence. In their ranks we find both the greatest repentant sinners as well as heroic men and women who lived entirely for Jesus. We find in them men and women in every walk and station of life: some were parents, others were priests or religious; some were rich, others were poor; some were killed for Christ, others lived a life of quiet peace with God. All were saved by the Blood of the Lord which we receive at every Mass in the most holy Eucharist and by that Blood were made worthy of Heaven.

Finally, there are those souls in Purgatory. The Catechism reminds us that Purgatory is the "purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven..." It is experienced by those "who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified" (CCC 1030). On this day, the Church dresses in black, mourning those who still need our friendship by our prayers to achieve the end goal for which they thirst: Heaven. She sings songs that are full of both fear, but also hope in the mercy of the God who saves us (check the QR code!). The prayers are punctuated profoundly by the need to live our lives more and more for Christ.

As we go through this triduum, let's remember the lesson of each:

Christ has conquered this world (Halloween).

You were created for Heaven (All Saints Day).

We must work out that salvation with fear, trembling, and hope (All Souls Day, see Philipppians 2:12)!

Book of the Month *The Holy Mass - On Earth as it is in Heaven:* by Kevin and Mary O'Neill



Book Review by: Melinda Pleiman

I would like to recommend : The Holy Mass - On Earth as it is in Heaven by Kevin and Mary O'Neill published by the Sophia Institute. It is a hard cover Lego Comic Book that ties in the Old Testament and how it is fulfilled in the New and how God chose Mary to bear Jesus for our redemption. The combination of visual arts with the information being presented draws you in. I have read it several times and learn something new each time.

It follows two people Cynthia and Fulton on their walk to Mass as they discuss the importance of the Mass and it's Biblical foundation. It is very detailed in it's descriptions of the Mass. It explores God's plan of Salvation and the Real Presence in the Eucharist. It describes how Moses and the Passover relate to the Last Supper and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The deeper meanings behind the various elements of the Mass and how God's instructions regarding Old Testament worship continue into today's Liturgy.

Connections are made through out the book from the Garden of Eden, to the Exodus, to the Sacrifice of Jesus and establishing the New Covenant. It ties things together that I had never thought of before starting with the similarity in how Sin entered the world in the Garden of Eden and how Sin and the power of death leaves the world in the Garden of Gethesmane. Another connection it talks about is how Eve is formed from a rib from Adam's side and how the Church (the bride of Christ) is formed from the wound in Jesus' side on the cross. There are many more of these types of connections.

While this book is a comic, it is very educational and I learned a lot about the Mass. It takes complicated concepts and makes them easy to understand with out over simplifying them. This is something that could be read as a family.

Saint of the Week - Saint Martin de Porres

An old illustration pictures Martin de Porres, finger to his lips—"Shhhh!"—as several mice peek out of sacristy vestment drawers, preparing to join a rodent "procession" following him out of church! Martin's rescue of these unwelcome "guests," and statues depicting him, broom in hand, feeding a dog, cat, bird, and mouse from the same dish symbolize his life and sanctity. Initially denied entrance by the Dominicans because of "mixed race" (Spanish father, Panamanian mother), Martin cherished society's marginalized. For him, menial tasks, lovingly done, were sacred. Great and lowly alike feasted on his charity. Enemies were reconciled by this "poor mulatto" (his self-description), kind even to those whose racism demeaned him. Apprenticed to a surgeon-barber in his youth—thus patron saint of hair stylists and public health providers—Martin dispensed healing and dignity to Lima's poorest, serving in them the Christ he adored for hours in the Blessed Sacrament. By the time he died, all Peru called him "Martin the Charitable," a title even those of us who will never be called "Saint" might still aspire to. —Peter Scagnelli

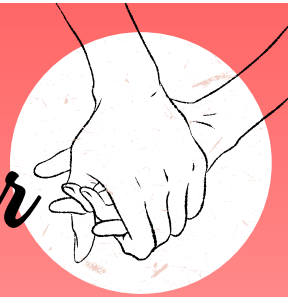
