Message from the Priests

Vocation Misconceptions

I hope that many of you have noticed that November is a month dedicated to praying more intentionally for vocations. It's really good to focus on things that are important. After all, it's hard for us to be giving 100% of our attention to multiple things. But, I have to be honest, I really dislike the misconceptions about the idea of vocations.

- 1. Not Just for Priests. When we think of the word "vocation", I think what most people think about are priestly vocations. Maybe sometimes people will also throw religious life into this category as well. On the one hand, this is understandable, because without the priesthood, parish life grinds to a halt. We need more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The problem though, is that if we restrict the idea of "vocation" merely to the priesthood or religious life, we are limiting ourselves hugely. This is because every single person has a vocation of one sort or another. The call to the priesthood or religious life is incredible, and we should pray for them; but we shouldn't fall into the idea that the call to married life or single life can't be just as special and fruitful in their own unique ways.
- 2. *Holy Marriages Will Save This World!* Married life isn't a default; it also is a call from God. If you are discerning marrying someone (i.e. by dating them), please do not forget that God wants to change the world (or at least your world) through the holiness of your family life with that other person. Don't take the vocation to marriage too lightly!
- 3. Choose Your Hard. Sometimes people will (subconsciously) try to dissuade themselves or others from a priestly or religious vocation by pointing out how hard it is. But every vocation is hard. Instead of focusing on the hard parts, how can we focus more on what is life-giving and meaningful about each vocation?
- 4. Single Lives Can Change The World! There's a huge difference between someone who is just defaulting to being a bachelor versus someone who embraces a call from God to be single in this world. To have people living in the world but using the extra time they might have because they do not have a family of their own, can be such a huge and rewarding service to the community at large. A single person isn't someone who just hasn't found something better. A single person is called by God to be the key ingredient to making something in the community so much better!
- 5. *Made For Heaven:* The purpose of every vocation is to get you and those for whom you are responsible to Heaven. Priesthood: get your parish to Heaven; religious life: get your religious community to Heaven; single life: get your community to Heaven; married life: get your family to Heaven. No one and no vocation is exempt from helping those around them to Heaven.
- 6. *Just The Beginning:* Sometimes accepting a vocation can feel like an accomplishment. But we have to remember that once we receive our vocation (i.e. on our wedding or ordination or profession day), the work of our vocation hasn't ended...it's just begun!



The Precepts of the Church

Given to us by the Church, these are the minimum obligations every practicing Catholic is expected to follow.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays & holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- 4. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.
- 6. You shall observe the Church's laws regarding marriage.

Baptismal Sponsors

This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.





mentioned in our recent annual business summary, we

are currently budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. These include a new roof, new gutters/spouting/downspouts and a complete resurface of the parking lot. Our goal is to set aside \$175,000 each year over the next 4 years (or roughly \$14,500/month). For reference, July PPI was \$4,300, August \$5,100, September \$11,200 and October \$26,300 for an average of \$11,725. We kindly ask you to keep this in mind as you make your weekly/monthly or special donations. The PPI envelopes are a separate donation from the normal weekly contribution envelopes and online giving. Working together, we can continue to keep Holy Trinity's buildings and grounds well maintained and a special place for worship.



Saint of the Week - Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne

Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints aresome native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose



joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life's undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: "She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she'll bring the mission success by praying for us!" Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless "spoke" to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. "Quah-kah-ka-num-ad," they named her, "Woman-Who-Prays-Always"—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint! — Peter Scagnelli




