

Message from the Priests

Seek and Be Found: The Joy of the Advent Journey

A Season That Opens the Heart

"Open wide the door of your heart—Christ desires to enter." — St. John Paul II

Advent is God's gentle invitation to begin seeking Him again—with renewed hope, fresh desire, and awakened faith. It is not simply the countdown to Christmas but a sacred journey of the heart. In this season, we become aware that God has already set out in search of us long before we begin searching for Him.

The Example of Zacchaeus: Rising Above What Holds Us Back: We see this beautifully in Zacchaeus, whose longing pushed him up a sycamore tree simply to glimpse Jesus. That small act of seeking opened the door to a life-changing encounter. Jesus stopped, looked up, and called him by name. Advent invites us to rise above distractions, fears, and routines so that we can see Christ more clearly as He walks into our lives. Peter's Cry of Longing: We hear this same longing echoed in Peter, who cried out, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." When the world offers noise instead of meaning, Peter's question becomes our own. Advent gently guides us back to the One who alone satisfies the deepest hunger of our hearts.

St. Thomas: From Doubt to Conviction: We witness a profound example in St. Thomas, whose honest search led him from doubt to the bold confession, "*My Lord and my God!*" His story assures us that sincere seeking—even with questions—always leads to deeper encounter. Advent invites us to move from uncertainty to trust, from spiritual restlessness to renewed vision.

The Importance of Advent: Advent is important because it teaches us to pause and make room for the God who desires to dwell within us. It reminds us that true preparation begins not in our homes but in the quiet places of our hearts. This sacred season slows our hurried pace so we can recognize the gentle footsteps of Christ drawing near. Advent reawakens our longing for the Savior and renews our trust in His promise to come again. Above all, Advent forms us into a people who watch, wait, and hope—knowing that God always fulfills His word.

Why We Seek the Lord: To seek the Lord is to open ourselves to the quiet miracles He is already working within us. To seek Him is to let His light enter the hidden corners of our hearts where hope longs to awaken. To seek Christ is to choose a path where His peace steadies us, even when the way ahead seems uncertain. To seek the Lord is to remember that every small turning toward Him is met with His abundant grace. And to seek Him daily is to discover that the One we pursue has been faithfully walking beside us all along. As we walk through this holy season, may our hearts echo the words of St. Augustine: "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." This

Advent, may we seek with sincerity and allow ourselves to be found by the God who comes near—full of mercy, peace, and joy.





BUSINESS MANAGER — As


mentioned in our recent annual business summary, we are

currently budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. These include a new roof, new gutters/spouting/downspouts and a complete resurface of the parking lot. Our goal is to set aside \$175,000 each year over the next 4 years (or roughly \$14,500/month). For reference, July PPI was \$4,300, August \$5,100, September \$11,200 and October \$26,300 for an average of \$11,725. We kindly ask you to keep this in mind as you make your weekly/monthly or special donations. The PPI envelopes are a separate donation from the normal weekly contribution envelopes and online giving. 

Saint of the Week - Saint John of Damascus

From almost 1300 years ago, John's message for the church's spirituality and mission surprisingly contemporary. Pope Benedict says that, in our modern culture of images, sacred images often speak more eloquently than "incarnational words. This theology," the concept that visible, tangible elements can give believers access to divine realities beyond,



found an eloquent champion in John of Damascus. He challenged the Iconoclasts (image-breakers), whose misinterpretation of the biblical prohibition of idolatrous images (Exodus 20:4-5) led them to campaign for the destruction of all sacred art. Before this controversy, however, John bore witness to Christ in a way that provides a timely example for Christians in today's pluralistic society. Succeeding his grandfather and father, John served as chief financial officer to the Muslim Caliph, professing his Christian faith without compromise, while winning the esteem of his Islamic sovereign by his competence and integrity. No wonder John could eloquently defend icons as "windows into heaven"—he had already learned to see Christ in the living icons of people different from himself yet fashioned in the same divine image! -Peter Scagnelli
