Message from the Priests

The following was sent to me by a parishioner who saw it on social media. I thought it was so good that it merited being shared just as it is. The Church teaches that "Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear. It is not surprising, then, that in Him all the aforementioned truths find their root and attain their crown (Gaudium et Spes 22).

The more we understand what it means that Jesus is fully, totally present in the Eucharist, the more EVERYTHING—the Bible, the Sacraments, the saints, the history, Mary, and even we ourselves—make sense!

What the Church Really Means When She Says, "This Is My Body"

There is a moment at Mass when heaven stops moving. A moment when all creation becomes silent. A moment when the priest leans over bread...and God speaks through human lips. At that moment, the Church does not offer poetry. She does not offer a symbol. She does not offer an idea. She offers Christ Himself.

THE MOST RADICAL WORDS EVER SPOKEN

At the Last Supper, Jesus did not say: "This represents My Body." "This is a sign of My Body." "This reminds you of My Body." He said something the world had never heard before: "THIS IS MY BODY." And for 2,000 years, the Church has defended these words with her blood, her saints, her theology, and her life.

WHY THESE WORDS ARE NOT METAPHOR

When God speaks, reality obeys. He said, "Let there be light," and there was light. He said, "Lazarus, come out," and the dead man rose. So when He says, "This is My Body," something happens. A change deeper than atoms, deeper than time. Bread stops being bread. Wine stops being wine. Only the appearance remains. The substance becomes the living Christ.

WHAT IS ACTUALLY HAPPENING AT CONSECRATION

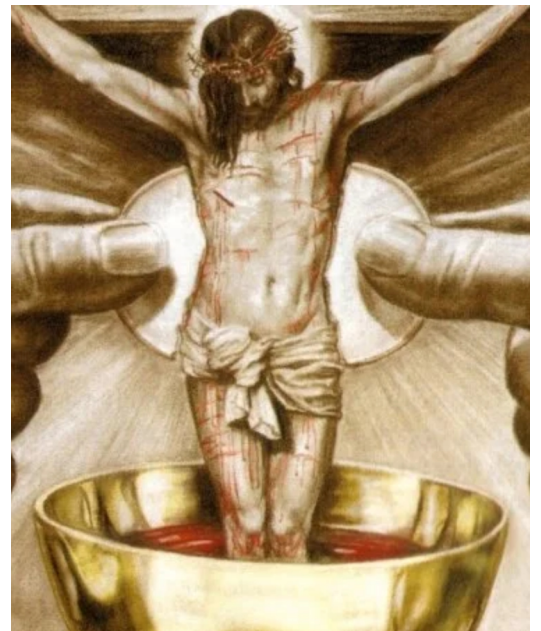
As those words are spoken: Heaven bends low, Angels kneel in ranks, the Cross becomes present, and the Lamb stands before the Father. Not symbolically. Not emotionally. Sacramentally and truly. The same Christ born of Mary, the same Christ crucified at Calvary, the same Christ risen in glory comes to the altar. Not in imagination, but in reality.

WHY THE CHURCH REFUSES TO CALL IT A SYMBOL

Because calling the Eucharist "a symbol" would make Jesus a liar. And the Church will never call Jesus a liar. In John 6, when people walked away saying, "This teaching is too hard," Jesus did not soften His words. He made them stronger: "My Flesh is REAL food. My Blood is REAL drink." If it were a symbol, He would have stopped them. But He let them go. Because He meant what He said.

WHAT THE PRIEST DOES AT THAT MOMENT

When the priest says "This is My Body," it is not the priest speaking. It is Christ speaking through him. Christ borrows his voice. Christ uses his hands. Christ acts through him as the Eternal High Priest. Human lips speak, but divine power works.



THE MOST FEARED MOMENT BY HELL

Demons do not fear statues. They do not fear candles. They do not fear buildings. But they fear the Eucharist. Because at the altar, the victory of the Cross is unleashed again. The moment Christ becomes present, hell loses its strength. This is why saints shook. This is why martyrs died. This is why the Church kneels.

WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOU?

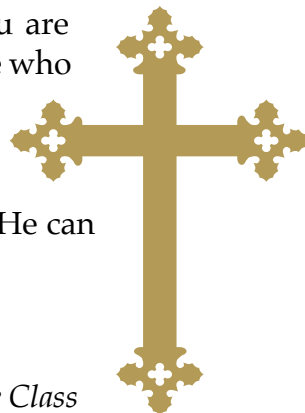
When you kneel before the Eucharist, you are not before a sign of Jesus. You are before Jesus. The One who walked on water. The One who healed the sick. The One who forgave sinners. The One who died for your soul. The One who rose from the tomb. He is there, hidden, but no less real. So every Mass, God whispers again: "This is My Body... given for you." Not a picture. Not a symbol. Not a memory. A Presence. A Person. A God who refuses to stay far away. He comes to the altar so He can come into your heart.

Lent & Easter Information

LENTEN ABSTINENCE & FASTING — Because Lent is primarily a time of penance for Easter, it includes days of both fasting and abstinence from meat. Ash Wednesday, February 18, and Good Friday, April 3, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of **abstinence** binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of **fasting** binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252)

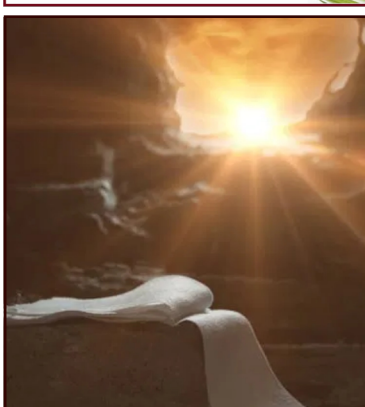

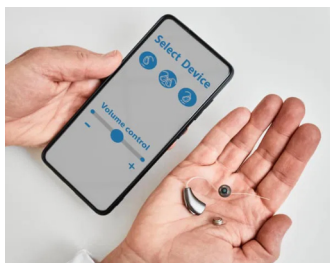

Thanks to a generous donation Holy Trinity now has a Hearing Aid Listening Assistance System. If you have hearing aids that are blue-tooth compatible, you are able to use the app and connect the sound directly to your hearing aids. Please follow the instructions below to download the app and connect to the network.



1. If not already set up, turn on the Bluetooth connection from the phone to your earbuds or hearing aids to send the audio from the phone to those devices (Bluetooth connectivity varies from phone to phone and the devices you are connecting to.)
2. Download and install the Listen Technologies "ListenWIFI" app on your phone. (The app has a blue logo with headphones on it.)
3. Go to your phone WIFI settings and connect to the WIFI network "Hearing Assist" (Some phones may need the "Listen WIFI app" set to "connect to local network" in the app settings menu.)
4. Your phone will most likely indicate that there is no internet access. Depending on your phone it may ask you to select one of the options. Select one of them.
 - a. Connect only this time
 - b. Connect Always
 - c. Ok to connect
5. Once the phone is connected to the WIFI network, open the "Listen WIFI app. (The app has a blue logo with headphones on it.)
6. Depending on the phone, click connect or next
7. When the app opens click the block to start the audio. May read "press to play"
8. Make sure the sound is not muted on the app.

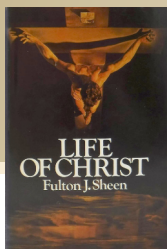

Book of the Month

Life of Christ

by Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen



Book Review by: Trent Pearson

This book was the first book I read when I decided to follow Christ. It's not a small book, 688 pages, but worth the work. I remember reading this book with very little understanding of who Jesus was and how he fit into my life. At one point I went to Fr. Dorn with some misconceptions I had that were challenged by the book. Fr. Dorn replied to these newly found pearls as opposition to the common belief that as he said, "Jesus is the big Pez dispenser in the sky". The book laid out the truth of Christ's life of suffering and poverty, how society at the time the book was written went against that Spirit. I believe the words written are still valid in our present culture. When we look to the wisdom of those souls gifted with a deeper understanding than we may have, it is a tool we can use for gain. Archbishop Fulton Sheen definitely is one of those gifted souls.

It can be an obstacle for some to say that when we read scripture we do not understand. It is good to remember the words written in scripture are written by man but are inspired by the Holy Spirit. It is no wonder it can be difficult to humbly tell God, "I do not understand", but trusting if we keep the conversation open between ourselves and God, He will give us understanding when we need it. This book is a conversation starter.

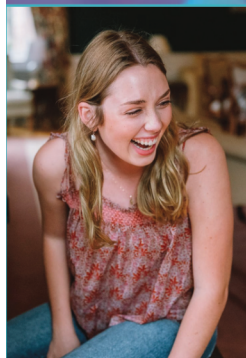

FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER — As mentioned in our recent annual business summary, we are currently budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. These include a new roof, new gutters/spouting/downspouts and a complete resurface of the parking lot. Our goal is to set aside \$175,000 each year over the next 4 years (or roughly \$14,500/month). For reference, July PPI was \$4,300, Aug. \$5,100, Sept. \$11,200, Oct. \$26,300, Nov. \$18,009, Dec. \$20,536, & Jan. \$25,683 for an average of \$15,875.43. We kindly ask you to keep this in mind as you make your weekly/monthly or special donations. The PPI envelopes are a separate donation from the normal weekly contribution envelopes and online giving. Working together, we can continue to keep Holy Trinity's buildings and grounds well maintained and a special place for worship.

Saint of the Week - Saint Agatha

As in the case of Saint Agnes, another virgin-martyr of the early Church, almost nothing is historically certain about this saint except that she was martyred in Sicily during the persecution of Emperor Decius in 251. Legend has it that Agatha, like Agnes, was arrested as a Christian, tortured, and sent to a house of prostitution to be mistreated. She was preserved from being violated, and was later put to death. Saint Agatha is claimed as the patroness of both Palermo and Catania. The year after her death, the stilling of an eruption of Mt. Etna was attributed to her intercession. As a result, apparently, people continued to ask her prayers for protection against fire.

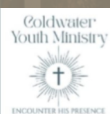
