Message from the Priests

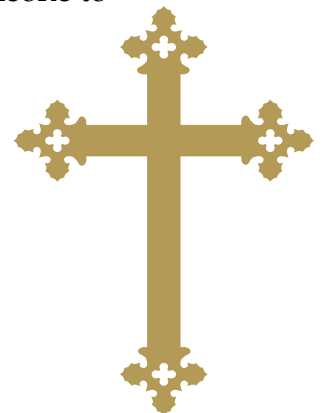
What to do 🤔, What to do 🤔?

I imagine that some of us have found ourselves a little bit more indoors as of late 🤖. The outdoors haven't been all that inviting, let's just say, and maybe we just have a little bit more time ⌚ on our hands than we usually do. If this is you 🙌, let me throw out a few ideas/suggestions/challenges in different ways to live out our faith.

Let's look at this like a ladder 🪜 starting simple and working our way up to greater heights 🏔️.

- 1) Catholic Movie Night: Pop some popcorn 🍿 get out all those great blankees and watch a new flick. May I suggest one or the other or both!!
 - i) All or Nothing: Sr. Clare Crockett: This is a truly wonderful story of an Irish 🍀 teenager whose life's goal is to become famous 😁 and how she becomes transformed by encountering Jesus. She is fun, funny 😄 and holy. You literally watch her transformation on film 🎬, and you can't help but be struck by who she becomes and how she lives ALL IN 🙏 for the Lord. *Video can be found on YouTube under the title name.
 - ii) Radiating Joy: The Michelle Duppong Story: Beautifully filmed, you are taken in a behind-the-scenes look at a modern day missionary. Michelle was described by her friends as "the Best of Us". The testimony of her joy in the face of her cross packs a spiritual punch 🙌 you didn't know you needed. This movie is a wake up call 🤖 and stirs up the deepest desires of the human heart 🍏. *You can access this video through the EWTN app which is free.
- 2) Visit the Elderly: We likely all know people who are upward in age 👵 👴, maybe family or maybe not, who live alone or out in the country 🌾 and especially in winter ❄️ just don't do a whole a lot or get out much. Plan a visit (maybe make it a surprise 😮) to their place. Possibly bring something to nibble 🍪, and have yourself a good ol' fashion VISIT 🪑 🙌. This is an honor, but so much more. Whether for Baptism or Confirmation, being a sponsor means that you are promising to assist the parents in raising this person in the Catholic Faith. In order to fulfill that responsibility, the sponsor needs to be a practicing Catholic. This means that prayer, scripture, the sacraments and especially Mass are important priorities in his/her life. This also means that a sponsor needs to be a fully initiated Catholic who has received the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Confirmation, and, if married, was married in the Catholic Church.

The Baptismal Class is required for all first-time parents and registration is needed prior to attendance. Lent & Easter Information Updates

LENTEN ABSTINENCE & FASTING — Because Lent is primarily a time of penance for Easter, it includes days of both fasting and abstinence from meat. Ash Wednesday, February 18, and Good Friday, April 3, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of **abstinence** binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of **fasting** binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252)

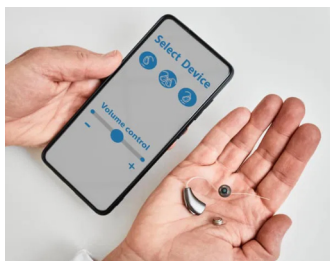

Thanks to a generous donation Holy Trinity now has a Hearing Aid Listening Assistance System. If you have hearing aids that are blue-tooth compatible, you are able to use the app and connect the sound directly to your hearing aids. Please follow the instructions below to download the app and connect to the network.



1. If not already set up, turn on the Bluetooth connection from the phone to your earbuds or hearing aids to send the audio from the phone to those devices (Bluetooth connectivity varies from phone to phone and the devices you are connecting to.)
2. Download and install the Listen Technologies "ListenWIFI" app on your phone. (The app has a blue logo with headphones on it.)
3. Go to your phone WIFI settings and connect to the WIFI network "Hearing Assist" (Some phones may need the "Listen WIFI app" set to "connect to local network" in the app settings menu.)
4. Your phone will most likely indicate that there is no internet access. Depending on your phone it may ask you to select one of the options. Select one of them.
 - a. Connect only this time
 - b. Connect Always
 - c. Ok to connect
5. Once the phone is connected to the WIFI network, open the "Listen WIFI app. (The app has a blue logo with headphones on it.)
6. Depending on the phone, click connect or next
7. When the app opens click the block to start the audio. May read "press to play"
8. Make sure the sound is not muted on the app.

FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER — As mentioned in our recent annual business summary, we are currently budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. These include a new roof, new gutters/spouting/downspouts and a complete resurface of the parking lot. Our goal is to set aside \$175,000 each year over the next 4 years (or roughly \$14,500/month). For reference, July PPI was \$4,300, Aug. \$5,100, Sept. \$11,200, Oct. \$26,300, Nov. \$18,009, Dec. \$20,536, & Jan. \$25,683 for an average of \$15,875.43. We kindly ask you to keep this in mind as you make your weekly/monthly or special donations. The PPI envelopes are a separate donation from the normal weekly contribution envelopes and online giving. Saint of the Week - Saint Josephine Bakhita

"Save Darfur!" That cry echoes around the world and in the heart of the Church, where a child of Darfur is one of our newest saints: Josephine (her baptismal name) Bakhita ("Lucky One," the slave-traders' nickname). Kidnapped at nine, sold in Sudan's slave-markets, flogged daily till covered with scars, Bakhita was finally bought by Italians and taken to Italy. There Bakhita discovered a "Master" who had himself been flogged to redeem her from slavery! "I am truly loved," she thought, "and awaited by this Love." Baptized, she often kissed the baptismal font, exclaiming, "Here I became a daughter of God!" For fifty years as a Daughter of Charity, Bakhita provided cheerful hospitality to all who knocked at the convent door. In her final illness, she relived slavery's horror: "Please, loosen these chains," she begged the nurse. "They are so heavy!" Her last words were: "Our Lady! Our Lady!" John Paul II canonized her in the Jubilee Year 2000, praising God for leading her "from abject slavery to the dignity of being your daughter and the Bride of Christ." —Peter Scagnelli

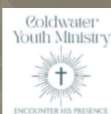
