

Message from the Priests

Lenten Series: The Grand Master Plan

This year, I am so excited for our Lenten series. As mentioned last week, we are continuing our Holy Cross Family tradition of halting the priest rotation. We always enjoy that and know that you guys do, too! Normally, each priest will use that as an opportunity to focus on a particular topic that is near and dear to his heart. But this year, we are going to focus on the same thing. This is a method of praying that I call the *Daily Prayer Sandwich*.

Origins

You've probably heard the expression: the family that prays together, stays together. When I first started meeting with couples for marriage prep, I would encourage them to pray together as a couple. But almost every time, I would see the same reaction: fear! I was so surprised at that. I would meet wonderful, beautiful couples who wanted to be close to Jesus, who wanted to be Catholic, so why were they getting anxious about praying together? Talking to these couples, I began to notice a few things:

1. A lot of these couples hadn't been taught how to pray since about 4th grade CCD. I'm not blaming the catechists by any stretch, but it's just the fact of the matter that there is so much to learn about the Catholic Faith. We often front-load the prayers, teaching young children to memorize prayers, and as we continue to educate them we just kind of assume that the kids are continuing or progressing in prayer. But instead, a lot of kids--myself included--just kind of stayed at that younger level of prayer. It got me thinking: if I was in the medical field and all I had to go on was my 4th grade knowledge of biology and anatomy...how good of a medical provider would I be? Moreover, how rewarding would I find the field of medicine? It's not that most people didn't want to grow in prayer, far from it! It's just that we don't always teach people how to grow...and the result is that they remain at that 4th grade level of prayer which they find neither enjoyable, nor as effective as a doctor or nurse with only a 4th grade medical education!
2. If an individual isn't comfortable with praying on their own, then asking them to pray as a couple sounds really intimidating. I couldn't balance on a unicycle to save my life. But what's the only thing more terrifying to me than trying to do so? Having to do so in front of another person! If I wanted to teach couples to pray together as a family, I had to teach them how to be comfortable praying on their own, first.
3. Families really do need to pray together. I'm not saying that if a couple prays that their marriage will never fall apart. We all know people who were good Catholics, but life happens. Sometimes we deal with it well, sometimes it leads to brokenness. I'm not here to judge that, I'm just here to be with them through that difficult situation and help them to find God in the midst of it all. That being said, prayer, especially deep prayer, can be a powerful glue for families. We all know it, we just need to implement it.

With all this in mind, I created the *Daily Prayer Sandwich*. This is a protocol of praying that is very basic (like a sandwich), but is still spiritually dense enough that it can keep a person well fed. It is by no means a steak: God has much bigger plans for us than this little sandwich can provide. But it's a start! And that's what a lot of people need! If you have found deeper and more profound prayer, that's great...but if you just need a basic place to start, this Lent is for you!

It's also for your family. One thing you'll notice as we unpack the Daily Prayer Sandwich is that it can all be done either totally individually or totally as a family and every combination in between. As families and couples get comfortable praying it on their own, they can start to incorporate others into that prayer as they are comfortable. So maybe a family starts by praying these prayers individually and they ask each other whether they did their Sandwich that day...but when they're ready, everything can be easily scaled at their own pace until they are doing it all together!

The Goal

Each week, the priest is going to unpack a part of the Sandwich, explaining it, talking about how it is helpful in the spiritual life, and giving practical suggestions. Our goal is that by the end of Lent, we all have a baseline of prayer that every single person in our Family of Parishes is engaging in so that we can grow in prayer together. By helping us all to find this "baseline", I know that God will continue to unfold the power of His Mercy and His Love more and more in our lives. What more could we want for our Family of Parishes?

First Sunday of Lent: the Morning Offering

This week, we're starting it off simple: with the first bun of the Sandwich. Every morning, as close to the first thing as you can, start by praying the Morning Offering. This is a powerful way to put your day into perspective: the purpose of our lives is to live them completely for Jesus. It starts by thinking about Him as soon as we wake up and reminding ourselves that everything we do, think, and say today can be done, thought, and said for Him.

This week, you'll find copies of the *Daily Prayer Sandwich* in your pews. Each family should leave Mass with at least one card. We will keep them available in the pews next week, so when you come back help yourselves to as many as are left.

Thank you for joining us this Lent as we unpack this small, but powerful way to begin to pray more deeply and to build a prayer life that is more rewarding and satisfying. This is just a beginning, but it will lead to incredible things as you grow stronger in your spiritual lives!



A Religious Recycle Group will be stopping by to collect Religious items that need a new home. They can take in or give just about anything of Religious nature that can be used by other churches, convents, or religious organizations such as:

- Vestments including Chasubles, Stoles, Albs, etc. (even if they are soiled or tattered, as we have them professionally cleaned and/or restored if possible so they can be worn, we can also use them to make new vestments, rosary cases or missal covers, we accept any style, color, vintage)
- Crucifixes
- Statues (any size, no outdoor concrete statues)
- Rosaries (damaged are okay)
- Chalices (Pottery)
- Altar Ware
- Tabernacles

Please do not throw anything out that may be questionable in condition as they take items in any condition.

As a reminder, it is important to properly dispose of blessed religious items that are no longer usable. Please burn blessed items, then collect the ashes, and bury them in an undisturbed place. For items that won't burn (like metal medals or statues), disassemble them if possible, then bury them in an undisturbed place, returning them to the earth.

Please bring your religious items on Saturday, March 7th to Holy Trinity's garage located north of the Coldwater Parish Office from 10 am - 2 pm.

The Holy Land Shepherds

The carving of the Olive Wood Tree has been inherited since the time of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It was passed down from father to son for many generations including our family. More than 80% of the Christian community income comes from tourism and the olive wood trade. 

Saint of the Week - Saint Polycarp

Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, disciple of Saint John the Apostle and friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, was a revered Christian leader during the first half of the second century. Saint Ignatius, on his way to Rome to be martyred, visited Saint Polycarp at Smyrna, and later at Troas wrote him a personal letter. The Asia Minor Churches recognized Polycarp's leadership by choosing him as a representative to discuss with Pope Anicetus the date of the Easter celebration in Rome—a major controversy in the early Church. Only one of the many letters written by Saint Polycarp has been preserved, the one he wrote to the Church of Philippi in Macedonia. At 86, Polycarp was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger. The centurion ordered the saint's body burned. The "Acts" of Saint Polycarp's martyrdom are the earliest preserved, fully reliable account of a Christian martyr's death. He died in 155.
