

Message from the Priests

Week II: The Nightly Examen

I hope and pray you had a great first week of Lent. The first week often has that feeling like, "the tank is full, I'm ready to go!" Last week, we went over the *Morning Offering*, a short quick prayer meant to be said as soon as possible upon waking. This prayer quickly orients us towards God, allowing us to begin our day with Him in mind. As we gear up for this second week of Lent, it's time to introduce the next part of the *Daily Prayer Sandwich*:

The Nightly Examen

The Nightly Examen is usually prayed near the end of the day. I recommend praying it before you get into bed (you'll fall asleep if you pray it there!). The purpose of the Nightly Examen is to prayerfully go over your day with God. This builds up our relationship with Him, helping us to see His hand more clearly in our lives. Additionally, this has a tendency to help us become better to each other.

Commitment

Around 5 minutes.

The Method

If you are able, find a quiet place in your home.

1. Take a minute to sit there and place yourself in the presence of God. You can even imagine Him sitting on the couch with you or otherwise there with you.
2. Next, think through your day, from the moment you woke up until this present moment: what are the things that you want to thank God for?
3. After thanking God for His blessings, what are the things that you need to own up to? How could you have responded better in certain situations? What are my sins that I want to ask God's pardon for? Are those sins mortal? Do I need to take them to Confession before receiving Him in Holy Communion?
4. After we make things right with God by expressing our sorrow for hurting Him, look ahead to the following day. What are the things that you anticipate needing His grace and help with?
5. End your prayer by repenting of your sins with an *Act of Contrition* or similar prayer.

How to Go Deeper

It's okay to ease into this prayer. It's simple, effective, but requires a good deal of honesty and awareness. Once you've gotten into the habit of this Nightly Examen, there are many ways to go deeper.

- Go into greater detail as you examine your day.
- Imagine our Lord in the Garden of Gethsemane, weeping over your sins. They didn't hurt an abstract concept called "God", they hurt a man. Imagine the love God has for you that He would die for you on the Cross to save you from those sins. You truly mean that much to Him!
- Make up with the people you sinned against.






Book of the Month

The Practice of the Love of Jesus Christ

by St. Alphonsus Liguori

Book Review by:
Deacon Dan Kahlig



At my spiritual director's suggestion I began this book a few months ago, and it has become a quiet treasure in my daily prayer. I read from it almost every morning; its pages steady and deepen my heart before the day begins.

St. Alphonsus writes like a wise spiritual father who knows our weaknesses and gently calls us to faithful love. He shows that holiness is not a distant ideal for ready-made saints but a simple, daily practice: choosing love in small moments, offering ordinary frustrations to God, and trusting Jesus in the ordinary rhythms of our sometimes hectic lives. These are not lofty demands but practical, soul-shaping steps.

Each chapter gives a short reflection and concrete ways to grow in love—an act, a prayer, a thought—that anyone can do, no matter how busy. Reading it feels like sitting with a friend who points you back to Christ's mercy and tenderness.

If you want a spiritual companion that will deepen your prayer life and help you live with more love, this classic may be exactly what you need. It has been my daily companion; I hope it may become yours as well.

FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER — As mentioned in our recent annual business summary, we are currently budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. These include a new roof, new gutters/spouting/downspouts and a complete resurface of the parking lot. Our goal is to set aside \$175,000 each year over the next 4 years (or roughly \$14,500/month). For reference, July PPI was \$4,300, Aug. \$5,100, Sept. \$11,200, Oct. \$26,300, Nov. \$18,009, Dec. \$20,536, & Jan. \$25,683 for an average of \$15,875.43. We kindly ask you to keep this in mind as you make your weekly/monthly or special donations. The PPI envelopes are a separate donation from the normal weekly contribution envelopes and online giving. Working together, we can continue to keep Holy Trinity's buildings and grounds well maintained and a special place for worship. Thank you for your generosity!

Saint of the Week - Saint Casimir

Saint Casimir, born of kings and in line to be a king himself, was filled with exceptional values and learning by a great teacher, John Dlugosz. Even his critics could not say that his conscientious objection indicated softness. As a teenager, Casimir lived a highly disciplined, even severe life, sleeping on the ground, spending a great part of the night in prayer and dedicating himself to lifelong celibacy.



When nobles in Hungary became dissatisfied with their king, they prevailed upon Casimir's father, the king of Poland, to send his son to take over the country. Casimir obeyed his father, as many young men over the centuries have obeyed their governments. The army he was supposed to lead was clearly outnumbered by the "enemy"; some of his troops were deserting because they were not paid. At the advice of his officers, Saint Casimir decided to return home.

His father was irked at the failure of his plans, and confined his 15-year-old son for three months. The lad made up his mind never again to become involved in the wars of his day, and no amount of persuasion could change his mind. He returned to prayer and study, maintaining his decision to remain celibate even under pressure to marry the emperor's daughter.

He reigned briefly as king of Poland during his father's absence. He died of lung trouble at 25 while visiting Lithuania, of which he was also Grand Duke. He was buried in Vilnius, Lithuania.






