Message from the Priests

Heralds of Heraldry: Carrying the Shield of Faith and the Tradition of the Church.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I was asked to write an article as a guest contributor and was told that I could write on a subject that I enjoy. Being the last person in my immediate family able to continue the family name, I have always been fascinated by family legacies, especially due to my Irish and Germanic roots. Because of this fascination, I have long been interested in coats of arms and tartans. This interest is also satisfied through the beauty of tradition within Holy Mother Church. The origins of heraldry were to distinguish members of different communities and social classes.

Within the tradition of the Church, shields and coats of arms are used to represent dioceses, bishops, popes, and religious orders. Within the last year, we have seen two important new coats of arms with the election of His Holiness Leo XIV and the installation of The Most Reverend Robert Casey as the new Archbishop of Cincinnati.

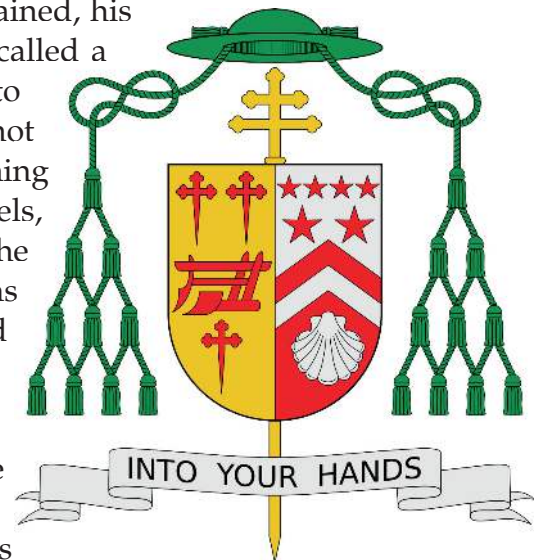
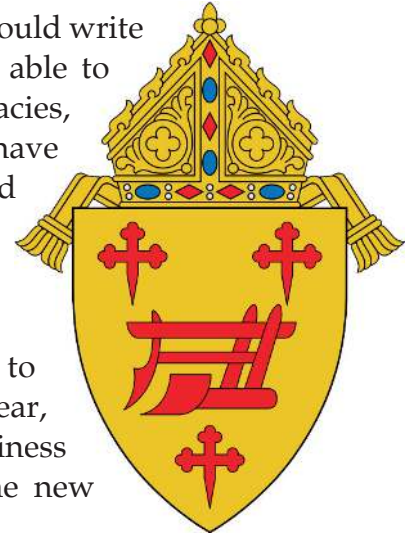
The beauty of this heraldic tradition is that when a man is ordained, his shield is either created anew or modified to include a black hat, called a galero, placed above it with a tassel hanging on each side. A motto may also be placed beneath the coat of arms, although it is not required. When a priest is elevated to a higher office, such as becoming a bishop, his coat of arms changes through the addition of more tassels, different colors for the galero, and other heraldic elements such as the pallium, crozier, and miter. The Supreme Pontiff's coat of arms includes the Papal Tiara and the Keys of Saint Peter placed behind the shield.

For the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, the coat of arms consists of the colors red and gold, representing Saint Peter, the patron of the Cathedral Basilica of the Archdiocese. Above the shield is a miter, representing the authority of the bishop. In the center of the shield is a plow, representing the story of the Roman soldier Cincinnatus, who was plowing his fields when he was called to lead the army. The three crosses represent the Holy Trinity and symbolize the faith being planted in the region, as shown by their pointed bases, and flourishing throughout the region, as shown by their rounded tops.

My Brothers and Sisters, we are blessed with a beautiful faith that is rich in traditions such as these. I encourage you to explore the traditions of the Church and discover the beauty and meaning they hold.

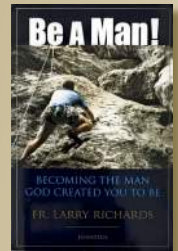

Be a Man! Becoming the Man God Created You to Be
by Fr. Larry Richards
Book Review by:

"Be a Man! Becoming the Man God Created You to Be" helps men rediscover the importance of the spiritual life, and Father Richards helps them do it. Father Richards draws on his many years of ministry and his own experience as a man to inspire other men as men.

In "Being a Man!" Father Richards recounts his struggles to learn true manhood, as well as the inspiring stories of others he has served in his decades as a priest. He tells men how to focus on the right goal, how to live as a beloved son of God, of the need to acknowledge one's faults and to live according to the Holy Spirit, to be a man of true love and of wisdom, to appreciate properly the difference between men and women, to pursue holiness, and to make a difference in the world. Not preachy but direct, Father Richards challenges men to be strong. He calls men to admit their weaknesses and limitations, while urging them to find strength in faith and genuine love and time to overcome their sins and faults. It is a highly readable book for men. 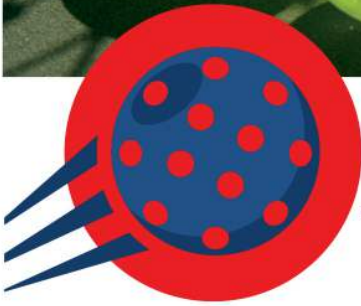

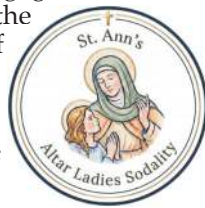
FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER —

We are budgeting our Parish Permanent Improvement fund (PPI Envelopes and PPI Online giving) to address three major projects within the next 5 years. Saint of the Week - St. Juliana Falconieri

Have you ever experienced the full power of Jesus in the Eucharist? Saint Juliana Falconieri experienced the power of the Eucharist so deeply that she decided to die with a consecrated host on her chest. Juliana was born into the noble Falconieri family of Florence. She was profoundly impacted by her uncle, Alexis Falconieri, one of the Seven Founders of the Servite Order. Her uncle taught her humility, charity, and a profound reverence for the Eucharist.

Rejecting the expected path of marriage and wealth, Juliana dedicated herself to God and the well-being of others. Her spiritual journey led her to establish the Servite Third Order of Servants of Mary. This community, under her guidance, focused on caring for society's marginalized while maintaining a deep spiritual life centered around the Eucharist. Juliana's devotion to the Eucharist was most profoundly demonstrated at the end of her life. Suffering from a severe illness that prevented her from swallowing, she was unable to receive the Eucharist in the traditional manner. In her final act of devotion, she requested that the Holy Host be placed on her chest. Miraculously, the Host disappeared, and Juliana passed away, her soul united with Jesus. Saint Juliana Falconieri experienced the power of the Eucharist. She valued it above all things. Her life—and death—were full of Eucharistic Glory.

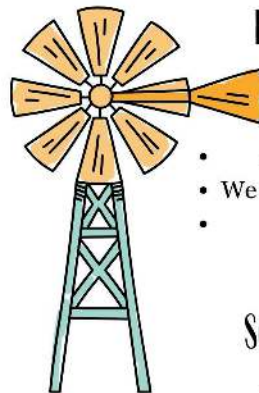
