Happy new year to one and all, I hope you had a great Christmas without too much overindulgence or hangovers.

With the Kent Battle of Britain Museum closed till Good Friday the 29<sup>th</sup> March 2024 it gives Dave a chance to start cleaning up some of the wreckage from the first production Westland Whirlwind Fighter, Serial No. P6966 (coded HE-Z) of No. 263 Squadron which was lost on 7th August 1940. The wreckage was excavated from the crash-site at Lanton Farm, Stenhousemuir, by a team led by Steve Vizard back in 1979 and recently acquired from Steve on long-term loan. With the aid of an air lance, Dave was able to remove a lot of the Scottish soil that remained impacted in difficult to reach areas and the start of the cleaning and conservation of the wreckage. Once completed this will be added to the display around the beautifully re-engineered cockpit and nose section of a Westland Whirlwind Fighter, the first phase of the production of a complete Whirlwind Fighter by the Westland Whirlwind Fighter Project.






Part of one of the engine nacelles from P6966. prior to being cleaned up and added to the Whirlwind display in the Stuart-Buttle Memorial hanger.

This Whirlwind was delivered to 25 Squadron\* at R.A.F. North Weald. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of July 1940. After spending a short time there, it was attached to 263 Squadron at Grangemouth and flown up there by S/L Henry Eeles and given the Squadron code of HE-Z. on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of July she suffered a tail wheel collapse at Grangemouth. Once repaired she rejoined 263 Squadron. On the 7<sup>th</sup> August 1940 now coded HE-X, P6966 blew a tyre during take-off jamming the undercarriage, P/o Irving McDermott who was flying the Whirlwind had to take to his parachute. This was the first Whirlwind loss.


## Greetings, Heijo.
