SEE, SAIL SMILE SUMMER CAMP 2025 PROGRAMME

Day 1:	Arrival and group introduction, followed by a two-night camping homestay
Day 2:	Discover the Netherlands: we start in the south around the campsite
Day 3:	We travel together to Lake IJsselmeer in the north of the country. There we will board a 19th century sailing clipper, the Broedertrouw. You will meet our experienced skipper and receive the necessary training to sail. You will check in and sleep on the boat for four nights
Day 4/5/6:	Sailing, swimming & fun Depending on the winds, we will visit one of the islands. We will visit picturesque Dutch fishing villages such as IJmuiden or Enkhuizen And, of course, Amsterdam!
Day 7:	Farewell party at the homestay camp
Day 8:	Departure for home



The Broedertrouw is a traditional wooden merchant sailing vessel, originally built in 1882. After a complete renovation, it has been transformed into a group hotel ship with modern amenities, offering a unique and unforgettable sailing experience.

The ship features fifteen twin cabins, each equipped with a washbasin and running water. Communal showers and toilets are available on board. As a group, you'll prepare breakfast, lunch, and dinner together in the well-equipped galley kitchen (kombuis) and enjoy your meals in the elegant dining room.

With its two masts, the Broedertrouw is a breathtaking sight under full sail. However, it is also equipped with an engine to ensure safe return to port when the wind is low.
