Camp description “From Ice to Lake” - Hands-on for sustainability



Together with around 20 young people from all over the world, we will show you **the incredible diversity of our beautiful Switzerland** and get to know country and people with a special connection to the topic of water. In addition, we will **hike** to reach some special places and high mountains, like the Morteratsch and the Diavolezza Glacier and have some special experiences there. We will prepare a new construction site and objects for the glacier garden (3 days) at the **Cavaglia Glacier Garden**

(UNESCO World Heritage), as a meaningful **contribution to sustainability**. We will also use the water partly for transport and above all for sporting activities.

Music “From Ice to Lake”

If you play a musical instrument and would like to contribute to climate protection for **the magical glacier world**, you are also very welcome as a **musician**. Bring a typical piece of music (folk) from your home country and your **own music instrument**. Three months before the camp, we will collect the tunes with sheet music and audio files and share it, so that everyone can prepare. During the camp, we will make music every day with our ad hoc band and perform again and again on the journey to Lake Constance to **melt hearts instead of glaciers with our international music**.

Playing an instrument is not a requirement for participation in this camp.



Water is Switzerland's only raw material.
