Executive Summary

Since the outbreak of war in April 2023, Sudan has witnessed horrific deterioration in security and humanitarian conditions. May 2025 marked a severe escalation with documented violations across Darfur, Kordofan, and eastern Sudan.









Urgent Steps to Protect Civilians and End Violations

1 IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED: Ceasefire, Civilian Protection, Humanitarian Access, Accountability
