Our order is celebrating the 800th anniversary of the rule that has gone through several iterations since 1221. The final decree was presented to the order in the General Constitutions which will be offered for your reflection in upcoming Messenger of Joy publications.

GENERAL CONSTITUTIONS OF THE SECULAR FRANCISCAN ORDER

Chapter I (continued)

SECULAR FRANCISCAN ORDER (OFS)

Article 7

All regulations not in accordance with the present Constitutions are abrogated.

CHAPTER II FORM OF LIFE AND APOSTOLIC ACTIVITY Title I THE FORM OF LIFE

Article 8

- 1. The Secular Franciscans commit themselves by their profession to live the Gospel according to Franciscan spirituality in their secular condition.
- 2. They seek to deepen, in the light of faith, the values and choices of the evangelical life according to the Rule of the SFO:
 - a. Rule Paragraph 7* in a continually renewed journey of conversion and of formation;
 - b. Rule Paragraph 4,3* open to the challenges that come from society and from the Church's life situation, "going from Gospel to life and from life to Gospel;"
 - c. in the personal and communal dimensions of this journey.
- * 7. United by their vocation as "brothers and sisters of penance" and motivated by the dynamic power of the gospel, let them conform their thoughts and deeds to those of Christ by means of that radical interior change which the gospel calls "conversion." Human frailty makes it necessary that this conversion be carried out daily.

On this road to renewal the sacrament of reconciliation is the privileged sign of the Father's mercy and the source of grace.

* 4. The rule and life of the Secular Franciscans is this: to observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of St. Francis of Assisi who made Christ the inspiration and the center of his life with God and people.

Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly.

Secular Franciscans should devote themselves especially to careful reading of the gospel, going from gospel to life and life to gospel.

* 3. The present rule, succeeding "Memoriale Propositi" (1221) and the rules approved by the Supreme Pontiffs Nicholas IV and Leo XIII, adapts the Secular Franciscan Order to the needs and expectations of the Holy Church in the conditions of changing times. Its interpretation belongs to the Holy See and its application will be made by the General Constitutions and particular statutes.

Article 9

- 1. Rule Paragraph 5* The spirituality of the Secular Franciscan is a plan of life centered on the person and on the following of Christ, rather than a detailed program to be put into practice.
- 2. Rule Paragraph 4,3* The Secular Franciscan, committed to following the example and the teachings of Christ, must personally and assiduously study the Gospel and Sacred Scripture. The fraternity and its leaders should foster love for the word of the Gospel and help the brothers and sisters to know and understand it as it is proclaimed by the Church with the assistance of the Spirit.
- * 5. Secular Franciscans, therefore, should seek to encounter the living and active person of Christ in their brothers and sisters, in Sacred Scripture, in the Church, and in liturgical activity. The faith of St. Francis, who often said, "I see nothing bodily of the Most High Son of God in this world except His most holy body and blood," should be the inspiration and pattern of their Eucharistic life.





Pope Francis' worldwide process of synodal consultation is fundamentally a "call to conversion to the whole church," and is "not optional" to such reform, San Diego Cardinal Robert McElroy said Jan. 28.

"Pope Francis has called the whole of the church to a profound process of renewal through a synodal process that seeks to touch and transform every element of our ecclesial life and our outreach to the world," McElroy told a conference hosted by the Franciscan School of Theology at the University of San Diego.

"The current synodal process seeks an outcome far beyond the issuance of new documents, or even a moment of change, but rather an ongoing process of reform and renewal that constantly enhances ecclesial life from the parish to the diocese to the world church," he said.

McElroy's talk was the closing plenary at the two-day conference titled "Re-Imagining the World: Saint Francis and Pope Francis."

This event was held at the Franciscan School of Theology, Joan B. Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice, in the Peace and Justice Theater on Saturday, January 28, 2023 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. On Friday, January 27, 2023 some gathered in a Border immersion program to hear presentations relating to the immigrant population at the border. We heard from speakers who work with those who are able to cross and receive services to assist them as they settle into a life here in America. We heard stories of immigrants seeking asylum in the U.S. One take away is that decades ago, when it was much easier to cross, many entering came for economic reasons –seeking employment, so they could sustain family members in their countries of origin. Today, due to oppression, violence, and torture, often associated with drug cartels, gang and human trafficking activities, the major reason people leave their countries of origin is due to an imminent threat to their lives, or to the lives of their loved ones. Additionally, others flee from countries experiencing conflict and some migrants are compelled to leave areas impacted by Climate Change (droughts, crop destruction, flooding). Those waiting for a chance to enter are not only arriving from Central and South America, and Mexico., but also Haiti, Africa, Afghanistan, Iraq, Ukraine, and Russia.

Some of the participants were given the opportunity to take busses to the U. S./Mexican border to witness what immigrants encounter when they wish to cross. Fifty years ago, I was in the Navy stationed at Camp Pendleton. A group of us decided that we would go into Tijuana to go bar hopping for the night. We drove across and back without any problems. Today one can cross into Mexico without much of a problem, but the checkpoint coming back is cumbersome and militarized.

Other participants were given a tour of the Catholic Charities run facility, where immigrants, just released from ICE detention and processing are supported before being released to travel onwards and to acclimate to life in the US in the care of family members, friends, or sponsors. Noreen Ringlein, OFS, JPIC Animator, chose to attend this tour. She noted that the Immigration Shelter is run out of a large hotel Crown Plaza hotel leased by the state of California to offer this entry shelter. The hotel has been leased since 2021 and since that time has processed approximately 150,000 immigrants from all over the world. Immigrants who arrive here on buses or vans dropped by ICE, sometimes arrive off buses still in handcuffs. The staff response in the Catholic Charites facility is incredibly welcoming and humanitarian. Catholic Charities demanded that ICE and the transport companies remove the handcuffs, while the migrants were still on the arriving buses and vans, so that they would know they were free once they stepped off the buses.

Arriving immigrants are able to access immediate health care offered by UC San Diego doctors and nurses. All immigrants are screened for Covid-19 or any other medical conditions and immediate care is rendered. Those with Covid-19 or exposed family members are separated into a specific area of the hotel and medical care is provided. On a completely voluntary basis any arriving immigrant is able to receive a Covid-19 vaccine. Healthy migrants stay in a different area of the hotel and the two sides do not mingle during their stay for their own wellbeing. Migrants have reported that at this shelter for the first time, they can bathe and are provided hot nutritious meals. Most have not had access to clean, hot water or a warm meal in months. Area restaurants in San Diego contribute meals to residents and rotate who is feeding the immigrants on a weekly basis. Families room together and are able to get clothing and can also order snacks and drinks across the day. There is also mental health care available to any individual or family. Many of the immigrants have experienced oppression, torture, and abuse on their journey to the US and some have PTSD symptoms. Migrants only stay at this hotel operated by the state of California, FEMA (the feds), and Catholic Charities for about 4 days. Then the majority of them have their own travel funds to move on to stay with relatives, friends, or sponsor's homes all across the continental U.S.

Subject: Change of Plans/Date for Chapter of Mats

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace and all good!

Last year we announced that we were planning to organize a 'never-before' event, a Chapter of Mats for the International Fraternity of the Secular Franciscan Order and YouFra. We have received so many wonderful responses to our plan and hope to have our own Secular Franciscan and YouFra Chapter of Mats. Our hope was to offer this once-in-a-lifetime family reunion in November 2024, however, unfortunately, due various reasons which we will state below, we have voted in the Presidency to delay the event two years.

The reasons for our decisions are:

- 1. The Presidency does not have the cash flow necessary for financing the advanced costs for the venue and services required to have the Chapter of Mats in a safe, protected area which is essential, due to weather uncertainties among other reasons. The costs associated with the event would be almost three million Euros at least 30% of which would have to be paid in advance.
- 2. The number of the possible attendees who have indicated an interest in attending is approximately 6,000. The 6,000 would not fill the venue which we have selected and is the only one available for 2024. We need to find a different venue which will be appropriate for the number of participants. Our prayer is to have the greatest number of brothers and sisters present with us.
- 3. The presidency believes that if we postpone the event until sometime in 2026, we will have time to determine if we can get donations (also helping us to pay for the advance costs) and, hopefully, to reduce the registration fee.

Our next steps will include:

- 1. Working with the committee to finalize steps forward, including, a possible new date (if it is determined that we can raise the funds), finding a new venue, finding local support, researching foundations, etc. (We already have many OFS families who would be willing to host an OFS/YouFra brother or sister or family. Will they be able to host once we have set a new date?)
 - 2. Finding donors from around the world with the help of our National Fraternities. (Specifics to be provided by your presidency councilors and a follow-up circular.)
- 3. Once we have confirmed the number of attendees and the registration costs, determining if our brothers and sisters will be willing to pay their registration fee in advance to offset some of those initial costs. (More specifics on date and costs will be sent once we have done additional research on possible donors.)

We want to emphasize that participation cannot be free, as we already indicated in the previous circular letter. (There was some misunderstanding about this, so we think it has to be stated clearly.) We will, however, try to keep the costs as low as possible, but surely, everyone will have to pay. These payments will have to be made in advance, otherwise we will not be able to reserve the venue and services.

NATIONAL MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Have you heard the adage: "If everything is a priority, then nothing is a priority?" [1]

Of course, we don't profess to live one article of the Rule at a time. But like the liturgical seasons, or the feast days, it does help to focus on one facet to deepen our understanding of it. We focus on one aspect while still applying the other aspects of our Faith and Rule each day.

General Constitutions Article 45.1 & 2 At many elective chapters, the National Fraternity Council sets priorities for the new National Executive Council (NEC). In October 2022, the National Fraternity Council (NEC members, 30 Regional Ministers and Conference of National Spiritual Assistants) voted on the priorities for the next three years: Vocations, Communications and Relationships.

A few hours after we set the priorities, I was elected OFS-USA National Minister. Seeing that I had the pleasure of serving the OFS - USA on the Vocations Committee for several years, I found the priorities to be very fitting. This article focuses on Vocations. Future articles will address Communications and Relationships.

During my tenure on the Vocations Committee, I worked with many others to come up with tools and ideas for sharing our love for our vocation and how to get the word out about the Order. (See the national website for the Vocations Tool Kit, brochures, Vocation Prayer cards, Testimonials, Elevator Speeches.)

Many of us are lifelong Catholics. What was your reaction when you first heard about the Secular Franciscan Order? Did you respond: "I wonder why I never heard of it before?" The same thing happened to me as a young adult living in Chicago. This reaction should be the exception.

Article 45 of the OFS General Constitutions charges us individually and as councils to promote vocations.

Are you convinced of the validity of the Franciscan way of life? If so, your enthusiasm should be contagious. I challenge each member of OFS-USA to meditate on why we became Secular Franciscans in the first place. Then, give serious thought to why the Order is special in our lives. Once we have thought and prayed about our own commitment, we will be ready to talk about our vocation to others. We will be ready to "spread the word" and the joy of following Jesus in the footsteps of St. Francis.[2] Who knows how many hearts we will touch?

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our liturgical year is in the Eastertide season – the 50 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday. The Church focuses on the coming of the Holy Spirit. We celebrate this event beginning with the Octave after Easter Sunday. These solemnities prepare us for the coming of the Paraclete on Pentecost Sunday. How blessed are we that Holy Mother Church celebrates in such a way that our hearts and minds are focused on the gift of the Holy Spirit – the third person of the blessed Trinity. The time period between Ascension Thursday (some countries may celebrate this feast on Sunday) and Pentecost Sunday is ideally 9 days – this nine-day period inspired the form of prayer call the "novena".

I am always amazed at how the Church has given us such a rich tradition of prayer and celebration to honor the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior. Delving into these traditions can only fortify our Faith and commitment to living the life of a true Christian. A recent homily I listened to brought home an interesting fact. All those that call themselves "Christians" – can they be honestly calling themselves that, when in essence every denomination stemming from the true religion of Catholicism has taken Christ out of their churches? What other church has a tabernacle? What other church believes in the Body and Blood of Christ being transubstantiated at the point of consecration? What other church believes in the miracle of Christ constantly giving us the graces and blessings we receive when we consume him and we become one, with Him, in Him and through Him? The joy we encounter every Sunday is not one of superficial celebration, heightening our emotions to a point of ecstasy, rather, His internal Joy permeates our Being. Often. I reflect on us as human beings, being such through Christ, without Christ we would only be a human existence.

A Prayer for Safe Travel


