Our Job Training Programs Include:

Industrial Manufacturing Training Pathways:

Designed to provide training and deliver foundational curriculum for middle-skilled to multi middle-skilled manufacturing positions. This 15-week, 300 hours course offers training related to Logistics, CNC Operations, Industrial Robotics, Computer Aided Drafting, Computer Aided Manufacturing, and Welding



Information Technologies Pathways:

Designed to provide training and deliver foundational curriculum for entry-level to middle-skilled Information Technology positions. This 15-week training pathway offers training related to Information Technology Essentials, Server Technology Basics and Programming Essentials.

Logistics and Transportation Pathways:

This pathway includes CDL work readiness course offerings which prepare candidates for truck driving school; additional courses prepare students to pursue careers as owners/operators. The two options are open to individuals 18+ years old with a valid driver's license who must also fulfil a pre-requisite test to gain entry into the program. Both programs include four weeks of CDL work readiness training to which after students may exit to take a CDL training at a licensed truck driver training school. Students wishing to continue must pass an additional checkpoint before completing 11 additional weeks of entrepreneurship, supply chain management and business plan development before course completion.

Pre-Apprenticeship:

11-week pre-apprenticeship provides manufacturing technicians with the knowledge and competencies needed in the advanced manufacturing environment. Partnership between Focus: HOPE and Macomb Community College to hire and train Industrial Manufacturing Production Technicians. The program provides OJT at no cost to the apprentices, credentials through Macomb County, Journey Worker status and full-time employment with an industry partner.

Construction Pre-Apprenticeship:

5 week, 120 hour program that will provide work readiness related to Construction including but not limited to carpentry and millwrights leading to occupation specific training and job placement. Participants in this program will also have the opportunity to participate in advanced training and apprenticeships.



Tree Trimming Program:

In partnership with DTE, Focus: HOPE offers a six-week tree trimming program. The program is designed to provide specific training at different intervals with each of the partnering organizations. Two weeks of work readiness at Focus: HOPE where students are emersed into the Focus: HOPE 5A's (attendance, attitude, academics, appearance and academics), daily affirmation statements, enrichment/introduction to remote learning, computer literacy, resume preparation, interview skills, financial literacy, team building and preparation and certification for the Certified Business Professional - Customer Service.

Two weeks at the Tree Trimming Academy where students learn safety protocols, fitness, the proper tying of knots, how to climb properly and the identification of trees. Two weeks in Truck Driver Training School, Students are prepared and tested for the Commercial Driver's License (CDL -B).

PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS MUST:

- Have a high school diploma or GED for all programs except CDL Truck Driving Readiness Section only of Logistics and Transportation program
- Pass a drug screen and physical (if applicable)
- Pass an admissions test at required levels for each program. Online testing is conducted at 8:30am & 1:30pm M-TH by appointment only. Call to be assigned a Workforce Development Specialist to assist you with navigating the enrollment process.
