## What is a Key Worker?

A Key Worker is a dedicated professional who provides guidance and support to families with children aged 0-7 years, helping them achieve their goals in a way that fits naturally into their daily lives. A Key Worker is there to ensure your child receives the right support in the right way, making a positive impact on their growth and development.

### **Key Responsibilities of a Key Worker:**

- Supporting child aged 0-7 years
- Working with the child, family and key individuals to develop and achieve your child's goals
- Regularly reviewing Therapeutic Support Plans to ensure continue improvement
- Provides tailored supports implemented within the family routine, home, school and community.
- Empowers and build parent/caregiver confidence
- Engage in early years childcare, kinder and school programs to ensure continuity of care
- Engage with care team professionals to ensure collaboration

#### **Benefits of a Key Worker Approach:**

- Provides a single point of contact for families ensuring consistent support
- Reduces stress by simplifying access to services and resources
- Encourages collaboration between families, professionals, and community services
- Builds confidence in parents and caregivers through shared decision-making
- Enhances early childhood development by supporting learning in natural environments
- Strengthens family relationships by integrating support into daily routines

### What to Expect?

#### Stage 1: Initial Intake/ Assessment

- Completion of initial parent consultation with key worker
- Completion of in-home observation
- Completion of in-care observation
- Completion of Assessment, if applicable
- Completion of care team meeting and consultation with all engaging professionals

#### **Stage 2: Development of Therapeutic Support Plan**

- Key worker collates all internal and external observations, assessments, reports and if applicable, NDIS goals.
- Formulates a therapeutic support plan based on collated information and evidence research.
- Therapuetic Support Plan reviewed by industry consultants (OT, Psychotherapists) for professional endorsement.

#### **Stage 3: Therapeutic Engagement**

- Therapeutic Support Plan implementation
- Sessions occur as per support plan
