In 2023-2024, 448,029,804 meals were provided, feeding 1,227,478 kids for the year. There is a signup sheet in the Narthex. Everyone 5 and older is invited to sign up (a chaperone is needed for children under 18). Sign up early! If we have more than 15 people interested, we can get more spots. This is a great opportunity to serve and put our faith into action. We will take a freewill offering during worship in the weeks leading up so we can make a donation when we arrive. 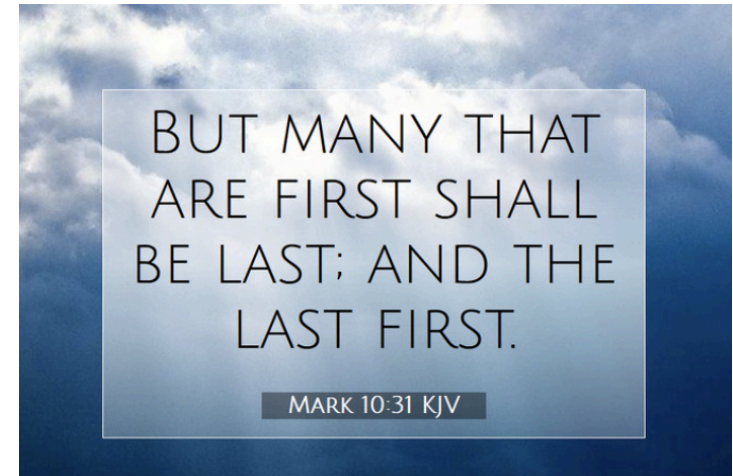
Community Announcements:
