### **Luther on...Righteousness**

All who are in the church, that is, all who believe in Christ Crucified, are righteous. But here we must define the nature of this righteousness. For when you look at the life and the morals of Christians, you all find much that offends you. Often they sin; often they err; often trifling matters crush them because of their weakness. All this seems to be opposed to righteousness. Therefore righteousness before God does not consist in doing or suffering this or that but in being enlightened by the Holy Spirit and knowing and acknowledging that Jesus Christ is our Savior, who by His death has redeemed us from death and sins. This righteousness is offered in the Word and is accepted by faith alone. This faith assents to the Word and believes that it is righteous through the death and merit of Christ.
