Various methods of engaging other disciplines and communicating VdTMoCA-informed OT will be shared, including a summary of the published evidence-base of the VdTMoCA.

Explaining VdTMoCA-informed intervention to clients and carers

Applying the VdTMoCA principles to explain occupational therapy intervention to clients and/or carers

Guiding colleagues and carers

Enabling colleagues to utilise the VdTMoCA for their everyday interactions and interventions with clients (therefore support what OT is trying to achieve).

Service development

An overview of the Analytical Survey for enabling OTs and/or the whole service to understand how it does and does not meet the needs of its client population and what to change to better meet the needs of clients at the levels of creative ability typically served.
