Marking the Swinging Bridge

The Association is in the process of securing signage at the former site of the Minnesota City Swinging Bridge (just south of the Post Office). A grant of \$300.00 was secured from the Experiment in Rural Cooperation to partially fund this sign. Many Minnesota City residents recall the bridge which was eventually removed because of liability issues. It is the hope of the Association to eventually commemorate a number of the historical Minnesota City sites — houses, churches, etc., that could become part of a walking or bus tour. To date, with the cooperation of City Council and private owners, commemorative markers have been placed at The Oaks, The First Baptist Church, and at the entrance marker to Minnesota City on former Highway 61. Updates on this project will be on the website.
