UNIQUELY REAL WALKING FOOTBALL – NO RUNNING – NO CONTACT – PROMOTING DUTY OF CARE

Welcome to BCWFL Walking Football ... Win or Lose ... Enjoy your Booze

Here we go again, another season begins! I hope you are all excited and keen to get playing league football once more.

The modified playing rules are available should anyone require a copy. The main changes are that we have adopted the FA rule which deems the ball to be out of play immediately if it goes overhead height after a goalkeeper makes a save. A sideline kick-in or roll-in directly in line with where the goalkeeper contacted the ball is then awarded to the attacking team. To remove any doubt on where kick-in's or Roll-in's are taken we have added a ruling the kick-in's must be taken within 1 metre of the touchlines and roll-in's to be taken with one foot on the touchline and the other foot outside the touchline.

All the league appointed referees are being asked to adopt a no tolerance approach to non-walking offences to deliver the consistency player's request.

Teams playing in the Over 60's, Over 65's and Over 70's will be able to select players who have 'Grandfather Rights' acquired from playing last season. Please be aware the league does have records of who is and who is not entitled to play and will be keeping a close watch on this during the season.

We (the League) were asked to assist in organising the FA WF National Cup County Qualifying Round at Ray Hall Lane for the Over 50's and Over 60's age groups in August. On both occasions we were blessed with great weather and some excellent walking football. My personal thanks go out to the referees Brian, Ian & Andy for handling the games so well. I send my, and the Leagues, congratulations and best wishes to the winning teams when they compete in the next stages of the competition

- Never engage in bullying, intimidation or harassment
- Speak to my team-mates, the opposition, spectators and my coach/manager with respect
- Win or lose with dignity.
- Shake hands with the opposing team and the referee at the end of every game
- Be an ambassador for your club.
- Not play a match or partake in any practice against medical advice.
- To inform the manager/committee of any pre-existing medical condition or injury.

Sanctions will be applied by the club committee if any of this code is breached.

The committee's decision on type and length of sanctions is final.

We are all raring to go and can't wait for our first match in September.

Despite being a relatively new team, Inkberrow has already seen some success, winning their first tournament in June this year. Hosted by Long Eaton Ladies, Inkberrow saw off some stiff competition, winning their first trophy on goal difference overall against Hartshill – a fantastic achievement for such a new and inexperienced team.
