2025 USUA Umpire Rules Certification Test

These questions have been designed to possibly have more than one answer according to different rule sets.

Mark all correct Answers - Both NFHS AND MLB(OBR) rules apply!!

One question MAY have multiple answers!

HINT: Question worth 2 pts MAY only have 1 answer... Question worth 4 pts MAY have 2 answers...

Can an outfielder catch an infield fly?

A: YES

B: NO

In the 4th inning Wanlass is replaced as the pitcher with Rose. The team used a charged conference on defense in the second inning. Rose's first two pitches are wild and the pitching coach comes out to talk to Rose to calm him down.

A: Allow the conference

B: Warn the pitching coach that he cannot make another conference. If he continues his ejected and the pitcher will be substituted for after he completes the at-bat.

C: Eject the pitching coach immediately and Rose is removed after he finishes pitching to one batter.

D: Only allow the head coach to make the conference to the mound.

R1 and B 2 are both between first and second base after a clean hit to the outfield when the left fielder throws the ball into 3rd base. The ball gets past the third baseman and rolls into the dugout.

A: Both the runner and the batter-runner are awarded home.

B: The lead runner is awarded third and the batter runner is awarded second.

C: Both runners are awarded 3rd base. Since they cannot both occupy 3rd, the lead runner is awarded home.

D: The lead runner is awarded second and the batter-runner must remain at first.

B1 hits a single to right field. At the time the bat hits the ball, the heel of B1's front foot is on the chalk of the batter's box. His toes are making contact with home plate.

A: This is an illegally batted ball. The batter is out.

B: This is legal.

With a 1-2 Count and no runners on base, B1hits a fly ball down the right-field line. While the ball is in the air, the umpire inadvertently declares, "foul ball". The ball then falls to the ground in fair territory. The coach of the offensive team requests the umpires to get together, changed the call and award be won the base he would have reached had the correct call been made.

A: The crew can get together, change the call and award be one the base he would have reached had the correct call been made.

B: The ball is dead and must be enforced as a foul ball. The crew cannot correct the mistake.

R1 slides hard into F4. R1 and F4 begin pushing each other. F6, the on-deck batter (B3) and a bench player (S4) run to second base to break up the fight.

- A: F6 and B3 Are not penalized unless they participate in the fighting. S4 Is ejected for leaving the dugout.
- B: F6, B3 and S4 Are ejected whether or not they actively fight or attempt to break up the fight.
- C: F6, S4 and B3 are not penalized unless they participate in the fighting.
- D: F6 is not penalized Because he was the closest individual to try to break up the fight. B3 and S4 are ejected.

With R1 on first, F1, in the stretch position, steps quickly back off the pitcher's plate and with a motion much like F1's pitching delivery, throws to the plate. R1 is thrown out stealing by F2 on a pitch out.

A: This is a balk. While F1 is not touching the pitcher's plate, F1 shall not make any movement naturally associated with the pitch.

B: This is legal. Offense is responsible for discerning if the picture is or is not engaged with the pitching plate.

B2 Hits a sharp ground ball to F6. F6 makes an off, fast throw to F3. Batter-runner slides head first into first base in foul territory, touching first base with his left hand, and over slides first base, F3 stumbles on the play, makes the catch and immediately tags B2 on the over slide.

- A: Interference. B2 is out.
- B: B2 is out, off the base.
- C: B2 is safe.

F2 sets up prior to a pitch with his entire foot out of the catcher box.

- A: Call time and request F2 to take a legal position
- B: There is no requirement where F2 takes his initial position except for pitches during an intentional walk
- C: F2 must only have 1 foot in the catcher's box until the pitcher begins his motion to

pitch

- D: If he is required to have both feet in the catcher's box until the ball is released
- E: if he is required to have both feet in the catchers box at the time of the pitch

A coach's defensive conference at the mound is considered concluded:

- A: When the coach or non-playing representative crosses the foul line.
- B: When The coach or non-playing representative returns to within a few feet of the vicinity of the dugout.

R1 who is in the starting lineup, turns his ankle while running the bases trying to go from 1st to 3rd on a base hit. A pinch runner can enter the game for him, and our one can re-enter the game later after getting medical attention.

B: False

With a runner on second, one out and a 2-2 count, B3 strikes out swinging on a pitch in the dirt. The ball bounces forward off of F2 and into the path of B3, who, as he begins to run to first, inadvertently kicks the ball away from the catcher who is attempting to pick up the ball.

A: Leave the ball and play as B3 did not intentionally kick the ball1

B: the ball is dead, if the umpire judges that the action clearly hindered the catchers attempt to field the ball. 2

Umpires can call an infield fly on a ball that is intentionally dropped.

A: the ball is dead, the batter is out and all runners need to retouch their bases.

B: call time, the batter is out and all runners are rewarded one base.

C: the ball is dead, but it is awarded first base runners advanced one base if forced.

B: this is interference, and R2 is declared out, and B3 remains at bat.

C: this is interference. B3 is Outten or two returns to second base.

D: there is no interference, the ball is dead, and are two returns to second base E: there is no interference. The place stands.

With a runner on third and one out, B3 hits a pop fly near the first base dug out. F3 who makes the catch before stepping into the dugout with 1 foot maintains his balance and immediately turns to live ball territory.

A: the ball remains live if the ground rules state "catch and carry" into the dugout is allowed if the fielder doesn't fall down.

B: the catch is disallowed; foul ball.

C: the ball is dead, the batter is out and R3 scores.

D: the batter is out and R3 stays at third.

With a runner on second, one out and a one-two count, B3 strikes out on a pitch in the dirt. The ball deflects off of F2 and contacts B3's leg, falling directly to the ground. F2 picks up the ball, then drops it and fails to make a play on either R2 or B3.

A: anytime a deflected pitch touches the batter, it is dead.

B: the ball remains live until B3 clearly hinder B2's attempt to field the ball.

With a runner on second and one out, B3 fakes a bunt and remains in the batters box. F2 return throw to pitcher hits B3's bat and rolls towards first base. R2 attempts to advance to third but is thrown out.

A: interference. Battery is out in our two returns to second base.

B: no interference. The ball remains live, and the result of the place stands.

C: no interference, but the ball is dead. And R2 returns to second base.

Speedy B1 hits a fair ball that bounces into right field corner. A spectator lies over the fence onto the field and picks up the ball. The umpires have the option of placing the runner at third base if they think B1 would have obtained that base without spectator interference.

The visiting teams batting order is able Baker, Charles, Daniel, Edward. Charles had batted lead off the entire season and goes to bat first, striking out to begin the game. Baker comes to bat next and doubles. The home team head coach appeals that Baker batted out of order.

- A: Rule Daniel out, remove Baker from second base and bring Edward up to bat.
- B: Legal play. Was listed as the second batter and batted in the proper order.
- C: Rule Baker out and bring Daniel up to bat next.
- D: Rule Baker out and bring Charles up to bat.

Andy is listed as the P/DH In the 5th spot of the starting lineup. In the third inning, George replaces Frank as pitcher, but Andy remains in the game as the DH for George. And inning later, the coach would like Andy to return to pitch.

- A: This move is not permitted. Andy may remain in the lineup as the DH but cannot return to pitch.
- B: This move is legal, but the DH role is terminated for the remainder of the game and George will be substituted for.
- C: This move is legal, but only George may serve as the DH.
