



Total sales for the season were just under \$54,000. We served 538 meals in the four non-Lent Fridays. We served 3,330 meals during the Lenten fish frys. Remember the first fish fry was snowed out.

A big thank you to all those who volunteered, especially the Ladies Auxiliary. The fish fry would not be possible without your generosity.

We are also grateful for the support of the Assumption Parish family. Throughout the season, we saw many new faces during the fish frys.
