## *Wildlife Wonders Worth Exploring*

The Balranald region is alive with hidden treasures beyond the roadside views! The lower Murrumbidgee floodplain and its surrounding wetlands serve as exclusive lounges for waterbirds, hosting approximately 150 avian species around Yanga's lakes and riverbanks. From graceful egrets and herons to spoonbills and sea eagles, it's a true paradise for birdwatchers!

Stay alert, as this enchanting area is also home to the endangered Southern Bell Frog, affectionately known as the Growling Grass Frog. Once common across southeastern Australia, this striking green-and-bronze jumper now leaps into the spotlight as a local gem.

As you stroll along the Balranald Common Bird Trail or wander beside the river, you might spot woodland wonders such as honeyeaters, treecreepers, magpies, and wagtails, evidence that even the most unassuming parks and fields are interwoven into a vibrant tapestry of wildlife!
