To successfully parent when separated, you often need to establish guidelines for the children and you as individuals. What was a 'given' when parenting together may no longer apply.

Parenting is not simply a case of who has the children and when. It involves all aspects of the children's lives. The following are areas of parenting that are commonly discussed in Mediation. The list is not meant to be exhaustive, but is designed to prompt you as parents to assist you in designing the parenting arrangements that best suit your situation.
