## **SHOW RULES**

1. Entry to classes is for members only and there is no charge for entry.
2. Entries must be received by the Show Secretary by Thursday 17th July 2025.  
LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
3. Exhibitors may NOT make more than one entry in each class.
4. The Hall will be open to competitors on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> from 8.30am – 11.00am for staging.
5. All exhibits must be staged by 11.00am on the day of the show. They may not be removed earlier than 4.15pm but must be removed before 5.00pm.
6. Exhibitors are not permitted to move other exhibits; they may only be moved by the Stewards.
7. All exhibits must be presented in accordance with the Schedule.
8. All horticultural exhibits must be the produce of the exhibitors' own garden or allotment unless otherwise stated in the Schedule.
9. No leaf-shine or similar will be permitted on exhibits. 'Oasis' will only be accepted if contained within a vase.
10. All exhibits must be stable and, with the exception of Classes D59 & D60, shall be staged on the show benches.
11. Anyone employing artifice or unfair means to deceive the Judges or obtain awards will be barred from any future show activities.
12. Judges have the right to withhold awards when, in their opinion, the competition is insufficient, or the quality of entries is deficient and to make extra awards at their discretion. The Judge's decision is final.
13. Points will be awarded as: First – 3 pts, Second – 2 pts, Third – 1 pt. Highly Commended – ½ pt.
14. Any protest must be in writing and delivered by 3.00pm to the Show Secretary for submission to the Committee for decision.
15. Any contingency not covered by these rules shall be dealt with by members of the Committee, whose decision is final.
16. The Show awards will be announced on the day of the show.
17. BDHS will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage to exhibitors' property during the Show.

## \*G75 LEMON AND SULTANA COOKIES

<b>Ingredients</b>	
350g Plain flour	½ tsp Baking powder
140g Butter	½ tsp Bicarbonate of soda
175g Caster sugar	2 Eggs (beaten)
85g Sultanas	2 tbsp Lemon juice (for the topping)
100g Lemon curd	100g Icing sugar (for the topping)
<b>Method</b> (Bake 180°C 160°C fan)	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Heat oven and prepare 3 baking sheets</li><li>2. Sift flour, baking powder and bicarb into a bowl and rub in the butter</li><li>3. Stir in the caster sugar and sultanas</li><li>4. Add lemon curd and eggs, then mix to a soft dough</li><li>5. Shape into 30 small balls and place on baking trays, allowing plenty of room between them</li><li>6. Flatten each ball and bake for 12-15 mins, leave to cool slightly before moving to a cooling rack</li><li>7. Blend lemon juice with icing sugar and drizzle over each cookie</li></ol>
