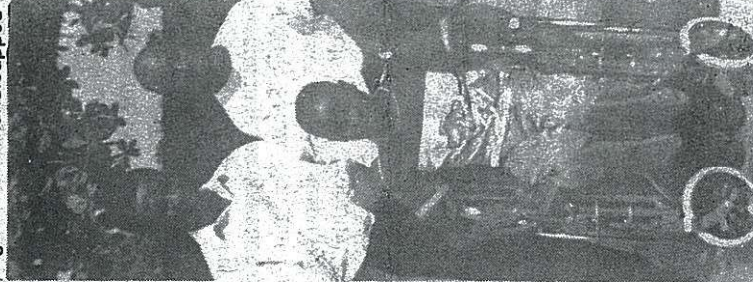


A Polio Patient Writes
